# Title IV-E Training Funding Background

- Same federal funding source as Foster Kinship Care Education, Social Work (Bachelor's and Master's Degree) Stipends, Regional Training Academies, etc.
- > CLPCCD's model is different and based on a model developed in 2000 in Ventura County.
  - ➤ Not administered through the state
  - ➤ Contract directly with counties and therefore use the county's federal rate (or proration rate) not state rate
- Currently CLPCCD has contracts in Alameda, Amador, Calaveras, Humboldt, Lake, Mendocino, Solano, and Tuolumne.
  - Monterey, Ventura, and San Francisco use different colleges





# Title IV-E Training Requires Cost Sharing

- The Federal Financial Participation (FFP):
  - 75% for most direct training expenses
  - 50% for administrative expenses
- Prorated based on the proportion of federally eligible kids in care in the county (by quarter)

# of total kids in care


