Mendocino County Air Quality Management District Thresholds of Significance for Facility Prioritization Scores

Pursuant to the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Information and Assessment Act of 1987 (AB 2588), and as required under Health and Safety Code sections 44300-44394, air pollution control and air quality management districts are required to establish the prioritization score thresholds used to determine which facilities must prepare a health risk assessment under Health and Safety Code Section 44362. Prioritization scores are calculated separately for cancer risk, chronic non-cancer health effects, and acute non-cancer health effects, with a facility's overall priority determined by the highest score across all three categories.

Facility Prioritization Score (S)	Facility Description
$S \geq 25$	High Priority
$1 \geq S \leq 25$	Intermediate Priority
$S < 1$	Low Priority

The above thresholds are based on analysis of the District's emissions inventory, facility data, applicable guidance from the California Air Resources Board, and thresholds adopted by similar air quality management districts throughout California. The District may revisit and revise these thresholds as necessary to reflect changes in applicable state or federal law, updates to Health and Safety Code sections 44300-44394, or revised guidance issued by the California Air Resources Board.
