The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the entire Mendocino County mental health system, resulting in the immediate need for Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) Substance Use Disorders Treatment (SUDT) to adapt alternatives for providing SUDT services to consumers including the limited expansion of telehealth. This limited expansion highlighted the need for additional software and equipment necessary to provide telehealth services throughout the entire County. The grant award will increase our current telehealth service capacity to improve services to individuals accessing SUDT by purchasing tele-carts equipped with web cameras, audio capacity, and HIPAA compliance along with expanded and updated provider equipment needs. These will be used in our groups for hybrid in-person/zoom meetings and in our front lobbies for those coming into our

Willits, Ukiah, and Fort Bragg offices in need of assistance.

SUDT serves areas with high unmet needs regarding the management of the opioid crisis and provision of mental health services. The grant funds will help develop our telehealth infrastructure further to provide improved and extended access to care for patients and more distance learning opportunities for employees to learn how to use telehealth equipment and hone their communication, diagnostic and care management skills delivered through technology.

Added telehealth infrastructure will allow both for service providers to increase telehealth capacity between the client and providers as well as to increase the provider's capacity to support connecting clients via telehealth to additional health care service deliveries, which due to geographical, cultural/gov't distrust, and infrastructural barriers the individuals in these settings have not been able to readily access without transportation support which is time-consuming, expensive, and

This project will link SUDT Counselors to patients virtually, provide access to behavioral/mental health services for marginalized populations, and supply resources to address the opioid epidemic and onsite access to distance learning for SUDT providers.

The expansion of telehealth in Mendocino County during the COVID-19 pandemic was critical to our population. With first-round funding, SUDT incorporated limited information and communication technology, including implementing a new electronic health records (EHR) system, which was already in process yet we continue to lack the funding for critical components such as signature pads, implementation of HIPPA and CFR 42 virtual platform, streaming media for groups, and video conferencing, to document protected health information and provide SUDT services.

There is increasing evidence of a mounting surge in mental and behavioral health care needs because of the pandemic in Mendocino County. CDPH data shows that Mendocino County's ageadjusted death rate due to suicide is 21.3%, compared with the statewide rate of 10.4%. The county's age-adjusted drug and the opioid-involved death rate is 30.2%, compared with California's rate of 11.9% and the national rate of 20.7%. By October 2020 we exceeded 2019's number of

deaths by suicide, with a projected 50% increase in the total deaths by suicide at the end of year.

Pandemic precautions contribute to risk factors: increased isolation, decreased contact with support systems, multiple losses (employment, income, loved ones), a sense of hopelessness, and helplessness. While our initial telehealth grant opportunity strengthened our primary operations' ability to provide telehealth, this expansion of equipment will allow for increased hybrid services to connect with those clients that continue to struggle with distance as a barrier to treatment services.

In rural communities, many individuals face a lack of privacy or anonymity and could be more easily identified when seeking SUDT than individuals living in non-rural areas. This might lead to a resistance to seek face-to-face treatment or services. We will address this issue by providing expanded services through videoconferencing, allowing the individual to remain in a space where they are comfortable.

Desired Outcomes

We plan to institute a fully functioning telehealth program to effectively provide SUDT services remotely. Establishing and strengthening our telehealth infrastructure is an essential step towards building greater health equity across the county.

By providing long-distance patient contact, care, advice, reminders, education, intervention, and monitoring, we can reduce the financial impact on patients, as well as their families and caregivers. A reduction in patient travel miles provides a valuable financial benefit by eliminating travel costs and alleviating potential childcare expenditures or conflicts with employment when relevant. Furthermore, it will reduce the time between provider requests for a consult and receipt of the consultation. This enables a more rapid response to people living with severe mental illness (SMI) in need of early interventions to prevent mental health deterioration or relapse.

The expansion of user-friendly technologies facilitates providers' ability to utilize telehealth resources, which increases patient and staff satisfaction. Additionally, it will increase provider distance-learning opportunities and allow for more collaborative meetings and presentations between practitioners. Further, it will streamline online information, health data management and healthcare system integration, providing a more rapid and comprehensive service response. This critical telehealth expansion is crucial for Mendocino County to bridge multiple service gaps and fundamentally improve county residents' health equity. It reduces the impediments to access inherent in low-income rural communities, such as inadequate or non-existent transportation, the burden of infrequent, inconsistent, and lengthy rural travel for people experiencing mobility issues, acute limitations on financial resources, and, significantly, the severe lack of rural staffing resources that often restrict access to care. Vital telehealth funding will allow SUDT to enact positive health transformations throughout our underserved and marginalized populations countywide.

Population Served

Please describe how your organization will utilize this funding to serve individuals with health disparities, including those living in rural areas. (200 word maximum)

Mendocino County covers a geographically expansive rural area comprising interior mountainous terrain and isolated coastal areas, resulting in challenging accessibility limitations. The county's rural population has a higher percentage of residents living in poverty than the statewide rate, and the median income is lower than the statewide average. There are many unincorporated communities with limited access to services and nine federally recognized Native American Rancherias within Mendocino County.

A high rate of our residents live in high poverty areas with 19.1% of county residents living in poverty, compared with 13% statewide, and 10.5% nationwide. Expanding telehealth services would enable a superior level of service options for these populations than what SUDT presently provides.

In addition, close to one-quarter of the county population is Latino, many of whom prefer or require

Spanish when receiving healthcare and interpretation services are crucial for their accessibility. Expanding telehealth infrastructure and services will allow SUDT to reach these marginalized populations by providing more virtual clinics, broadening virtual options for group meetings, expanding interpretation services for clients in-person and virtually, as well as provide distance learning opportunities for staff to train and become competent in telehealth communication, diagnostic and care management technologies
