# June - Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Awareness Month



Behavioral Health & Recovery Services honors June as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Awareness Month. While PTSD is often associated with military veterans; PTSD is a mental health condition that can impact anyone of any age after experiencing or witnessing a traumatic event. While it is normal and expected to experience stress reactions following traumatic incidents, PTSD is categorized by several months of symptoms such as unwanted memories, nightmares, heightened reactions, anxiety, and or depressed mood impairing one's ability to perform in social, work, or other key

life activities. PTSD presents differently in individuals and is treatable through a number of evidence-based treatments, however many individuals do not seek treatment. PTSD Awareness Day was recognized in 2010 with the United States designating the month of June as PTSD Awareness Month in 2014. Additional information and resources available HERE.

#### **Employee Highlight - Success Story**

During the month of June, we would like to draw the spotlight on a County Employee, **Sarah Downey,** who took an entry-level position with the County, applied herself diligently to professional growth, and is now on track for further advancement and certification within the Environmental Health department.

Sarah came to Environmental Health as a Staff Assistant with a Bachelor's Degree in Liberal Arts. Her degree allowed her to move into the Environmental Health Technician role as an inspector, but to promote in the inspector career path she needed 30+

additional Science and Math units. She spent the last 4 years taking 11 classes (including prerequisites), 5-14 units per semester, at Mendocino College earning a 3.47gpa while working full time. The classes she took are part of the Environmental Health Specialist education requirement and include courses in Chemistry, Microbiology, Physics, and Calculus. This higher education and certification will allow Sarah to move into the next higher class specification and allow her to sit for the Registered Environmental Health Specialist exam at the state level. This exam is a lot like the Bar exam for lawyers. It's really hard, and it's what gives Health Inspectors their highest level of certification.

It is very difficult to recruit high-quality advanced inspectors. The process that Sarah has taken effectively "grows our own" talent from within our department. This different approach to recruitment takes employees that already live here, that are well established in the community, that we trust to look after the people and the environment and help them achieve their goals so that they can continue to serve the public in more advanced positions for many more years. Congratulations Sarah!

The Animal Protection Unit worked 257 calls for service in May 2023, with 108 of the calls for service being categorized as a

priority "biting animals, cruelty complaints, animals in distress, aggressive loose animals, injured animals and Law Enforcement assist."

Behavioral Health & Recovery Services Prevention and Wellness has organized and conducted a total of 5 Narcan trainings, comprised of four small training sessions and one large training session that was specifically intended for our city maintenance workers. #### **General Services Agency**

The General Services Agency, Facilities Division is charged with routine and emergency maintenance, utility payments, custodial services, and grounds-keeping responsibilities for all County owned and several leased facilities. Other responsibilities include project management for larger-scale deferred maintenance projects and maintenance of all County owned parks and recreational areas. ### **Planning and Building**

The Code Enforcement Division received a total of 109 complaints in the month of May 2023. This number incorporates complaints concerning regular code violations, abandoned vehicles, and violations within the Town of Mendocino.

Code Enforcement Officers were able to close 28 of these new cases following compliance from property owners.

#### **Public Health**

In 2019, Public Health conducted a county-wide community health needs assessment. Priority issues: mental health, alcohol, and drug abuse, homelessness, access to healthy foods, housing, and hunger. #### **Social Services**

Medi-Cal renewals have resumed and MCDSS encourages beneficiaries to make sure their contact information is up to date and any changes are reported in order to avoid discontinuance of benefits. In 2022, Mendocino

County Department of Social Services, Adult Protective Services (APS), received 1289 reports of suspected elder or dependent adult abuse or neglect through various methods including our toll-free number 1-877-327-1799. Of the 1289 reports received, 878 individuals required a full investigation and short-term case management to set up services and a safety net to prevent further harm. These reports were from all sectors and areas of the county. APS social workers respond to reports 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Educating the public about elder and dependent adult abuse and neglect means that more people will become aware of the issue in its many forms and provides a wider safety net for some of the most vulnerable members of our communities. 
