
Mendocino County Pre-Trial Release Program Review

Introduction


- Senate Bill 129 (Stats. 2021, ch. 69), amending the Budget Act of 2021, provides funding for "the implementation and operation of ongoing court programs and practices that promote the safe, efficient, fair, and timely pretrial release of individuals booked into jail"
- In response to the Humphrey decision and the subsequent passage of Senate Bill 129, Mendocino County entered into a 3-year MOU with Mendocino County Superior Court for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2024, which allocated 100% of the funding to Mendocino County Probation
 - > \$206,368.46 (one time "start-up" funds)
 - > \$200,000.00 (annual services allocation)
- Mendocino County has entered into an additional 3-year MOU with Mendocino County Superior Court for the period of July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2027, which allocates 100% of the annual on-going funding (\$200,000.00) to Mendocino County Probation




- Mendocino County's Pretrial Release Program became operational on June 30, 2022
- The following data graphs capture the second year of compiled data, including bookings and assessments, those granted release on PTR Monitoring, and the monitoring outcomes




















625 OUT-OF-CUSTODY ORDERED COURT APPEARANCES AS OF JUNE 30, 2024
