#### Summary of Proposed Project.

Mendocino County Public Health Department (PH), Community Wellness Division (CW) houses the California Tobacco Control Program and the local Tobacco Retail License Program (TRL). PH administers the local TRL Program for unincorporated Mendocino County and supports jurisdictions in developing and implementing local tobacco control policies, including tobacco retail policies. The proposed activities aim to conduct enforcement operations county-wide and allow PH to expand by partnering with the City of Ukiah and the City of Willits to educate retailers about tobacco state and local laws and enforce tobacco laws. PH will enter into a contract with the City of Ukiah and the City of Willits to work in partnership with code enforcement/compliance officers and conduct minor decoy operations, compliance checks and inspections of tobacco retailers. Funds from this grant will allow for the expansion of such activities and together provide retailer education, training, and diversion for retailers violating state tobacco laws in their jurisdiction. PH staff will conduct enforcement operations, retailer compliance inspections, and provide retailer training and education in Mendocino County.

## 14. Problem Statement

#### Geographic Areas Covered by Project

Mendocino County (pop. 91,145) lies 120 miles North of San Francisco on the Pacific coast. The county's rugged terrain covers 3,500 sq. miles and has 4 incorporated cities and several sizable unincorporated townships. Ukiah is the largest incorporated city with a pop. 16,496. The remainder of residents live in rural communities pocketed between vast wilderness, one-third of which are along the coastline. Willits is located at the center 23 miles north of Ukiah with a population of 4,968.

## **Problem Statement Narrative**

The California Youth Tobacco Survey (CYTS) 2023 data shows tobacco product use by middle and high school students in California is higher than the average use. CYTS data shows that in Mendocino County approximately 16.4% of middle and high school students reported using tobacco products in the last 30 days. 32.2% of these students have used vapes, 13.3% currently use vape products, and 10.5% have used cigarettes. CYTS data shows that 82.3% of students reported trying vapes as their first tobacco product. 24.6% of students report buying vapes themselves and 35.7% of students reported asking someone to buy vape(s) for them. There are 116 licensed tobacco retailers in Mendocino County which comes to 1.3 per 1,000 population. 10 of these retailers are within 500 feet of a school and 30 are within 1,000 feet of a school (cthat. org). Funds from this grant will allow Mendocino County Public Health to enforce state law and local tobacco ordinances and conduct regular tobacco minor decoy operations and undercover buys county-wide to help reduce the number of illegal sales to minors and address the statewide flavor ban.

#### Additional details regarding retail inspections planned

Funds from this grant will allow for the expansion of compliance checks in all of Mendocino County. Retailer inspections will be conducted in person to ensure compliance and that retailers are up to date with current tobacco state laws and local ordinances. As part of the visits training on applicable laws will be provided on site or offered as follow-up training. Corrective action recommendations will be provided to help retailers achieve compliance. For non-compliant retailers, a verbal warning will be issued during the first site visit and a notification that a second follow-up visit will occur. Follow-up visits will be conducted to reassess compliance and provide further assistance.

#### Additional details regarding minor decoy operations planned

Funds from this grant will allow Mendocino County to conduct enforcement operations to enforce state tobacco laws and local ordinances to reduce illegal sales of tobacco products to minors and the sale of single-vape products. PH staff will recruit, hire, and train young adults under the age of 20 for minor decoy operations. Two decoy operations will be conducted in all 116 tobacco retailers per grant year. In the City of Ukiah and City of Willits, decoy operations will be conducted in collaboration with Code Enforcement officers. Mendocino County Public Health staff will ensure officers receive appropriate training for such activities. A data tracking sheet and backup documentation for all decoy operations will be maintained and updated.

Undercover buy operations will be conducted to ensure retailer compliance with state law and local tobacco ordinances. PH staff will conduct undercover buys to check for violations of flavored tobacco products or single-use vape products in Mendocino County. In the course of the 3-year grant, all retailers will be targeted at least once.

As part of the visits, training on applicable laws will be provided at the time of the retailer site visit or offered as follow-up training per the store owner or manager's request. Retailer training program education materials include state and county tobacco laws, employee training, acceptable ID, and development of store policies. PH staff will provide resources aimed to increase retailer compliance with prohibitions on tobacco sales to minors and the statewide flavor ban. PH staff will also provide training and enforcement on an anticipated local ordinance in Mendocino County addressing tobacco product waste. Funding is needed to conduct compliance checks and inspections and expand retailer education and training activities countywide.

## Prior Award(s) Comparison: Describe any interaction between proposed activities and those awarded under any prior grant.

Mendocino County Public Health Department (PH) received funding in the amount of \$459,210 for the previous award term: December 1, 2021-June 30, 2025. FY 22-25 has allowed PH to provide public education outreach and establish systems for retail compliance observing the number of retailers and identifying the number of problematic retailers. This grant will allow PH to expand retailer compliance efforts with law enforcement and partner agencies targeting potential problematic retailers. Additionally, PH would like to conduct undercover buys and minor decoy enforcement operations to decrease illegal sales of flavored tobacco products and sales to minors in all jurisdictions.

# Prior Grant Successes/Challenges: Describe the agency's previous award(s) including successes and challenges. Provide evidence of the impact of the agency's previous actions performed as part of the previous grant award(s).

Activities were challenging due to the COVID-19 pandemic, staff turnover, and a repetitive re-learning cycle. Despite these challenges, we began to see success through increased public outreach education, retailer site visits, and training. Beginning Summer 2023, we observed educational efforts improved tobacco retailers' compliance. We have conducted 183 retailer education visits, 56 store retailer inspection/license checks, and have found 5 sites failed to display a valid license, and 2 stores selling flavored tobacco products. Ukiah and Willits have requested partnerships to support further enforcement in the incorporated area as it has been reported that tobacco retailers are selling to minors and shelving flavored tobacco products.
