(Industry to provide specific sites and detailed description of proposed activities and operations of such sites.) 2. Look at expanding zoning options in Chapter 20.243- Cannabis Facilities. (Look at mirroring the cannabis shared facility language in draft Coastal Ordinance for Inland ordinance update.) 3. Recommend to the BOS creation of a Cannabis Innovation Zone ordinance or policy. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Come forward with innovative business ideas to bring to the County for Innovation Zones. 2. Press for civil administrative (and/or greater law enforcement, as agreed upon by all) (ex. Humboldt County) to bring in the underground market to legal market. 3. Stabilize the local supply chain and seek to expand local cultivation to close the loop on the local supply chain. 4. Research mechanisms to fund a comprehensive, countywide EIR that will include Innovation Zones and micro-business opportunities to increase innovation. 5. Take research to create actionable ideas and a comprehensive scope. 6. Do outreach and research regarding S-Type licensed facilities for small-scale manufacturing to access the viability of S-type manufacturing. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Industry leads efforts by providing potential Innovation Zone sites for County staff. (Industry brings vision and plan to the County Planning Department in compliance with Board directives. County staff will develop (EZ) for Board approval.) 2. Can the County give financial incentives for cannabis business development through fee waivers or other incentives? Industry can propose a fee waiver or other incentives. Incentives will be reviewed by the Board, if approved staff would implement.
