## Purpose of CDBG

The primary federal objective of the CDBG program is the development of viable urban communities by:

- Providing decent housing
- Suitable living environment
- Expanding economic opportunities

Principally, for persons of low- and moderate-income.



## **CDBG Projects & Programs**

2 Project Criteria: they must meet a National Objective & be an Eligible Activity

### **1.** National Objective

- Benefit to Low-to-Moderate Income persons
- Aid in the prevention or elimination of blight, or
- Provide funding for projects that have a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community.

### 2. CDBG Eligible Activities

- Acquisition of Real Property
- Architectural Barrier Removal
- Clearance, Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, and Construction of Buildings (including Housing)
- Code Enforcement
- Disposition of Real Property
- Economic Assistance to For Profit Businesses
- Homeownership Assistance
- Housing Services

- Lead Based Paint Hazard Evaluation and Reduction
- Loss of Rental Income
- Microenterprise Assistance
- Payment of Non-Federal Share
- Planning and Capacity Building
- Program Administration
- Public Facilities and Improvements and Privately-Owned Utilities
- Public Services
- Relocation

## **CDBG Ineligible Activities**

- General government expenses.
- Operating and maintenance expenses for public facilities, improvements and services.
  - Road repair, park upkeep, new department vehicles, etc.
- Improvements to buildings for the conduct of government, except to create accessibility for disabled population.
  - Roof and building repairs for county general administrative buildings, offices and court houses.
- Political or religious activities
- Purchase of equipment or furnishings for a property excluding manufacturing equipment connected with economic development activities and the purchase of fire trucks.
- New housing construction.
- Income payments.
- Lobbying activities.
- Program Income (PI) Projects: Planning projects (assessments, feasibility studies, etc.), Public services

### CDBG FUNDING

#### **Program Income (PI)**

- Some CDBG activities, such as business assistance loans, generate program income, extending CDBG dollars further.
- PI is defined as gross income generated from CDBG funds and may only be used for eligible CDBG projects or programs that comply with federal requirements.
- PI cannot be banked, and there must be a plan in place to use existing PI funds before applying for further CDBG funding.
- PI can be allocated in three different ways:
  - Including PI in the application budget when applying for an over-the-counter (OTC) or competitive award.
  - Submitting a PI-only application for a CDBG-eligible activity (which can be submitted at any time).
  - Adding PI to an existing award.

#### **CDBG Grants - Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)**

- Projected 2024 NOFA drop date is late January 2024.
  - HCD requires that grantees arrange for independent audits on all CDBG grants consistent with 2 CFR 200.500 to 200.512.
- **2024 NOFA Application Options:** 
  - 1 Over-the-Counter (OTC) & 1 Competitive
  - 2 Competitive
- **Over-the-Counter (OTC) Solicitation (81%):** 
  - Infrastructure, public facility, housing, or economic development project: up to \$3.25 million
  - Housing program: up to \$1.5 million
  - Economic development: up to \$1.5 million
- **Competitive Solicitation (9%):** 
  - Public services: up to \$250,000
  - Planning and technical assistance: up to \$250,000

### CDBG PROJECT IDEAS FOR MENDOCINO CO.

2 Project Criteria: they must meet a National Objective & be an Eligible Activity

### **Project Ideas from County Requests**

- County facilities: ADA, infrastructure &/or energy efficiency improvements
- In house economic development technical assistance
- Planning & feasibility studies (ADA & CSA) not Pl eligible
- See detailed list in staff memo

### **Project Ideas from Community Listening Sessions**

- Down payment assistance for homes
- Affordable & workforce housing development projects
- Workforce development programs/local trade programs not PI eligible
- Broadband expansion
- Water & sewer planning not PI eligible
- Sidewalk repairs & beautification projects in unincorporated areas
- Microgrids/solar/energy projects
- Regional community resiliency/disaster centers
- Food security & distribution

## **CDBG NEXT STEPS**

#### **Program Income**

- Staff Proposal
  - Amend current Business Assistance Loan
     Program Agreement to cover expenses incurred and current fiscal year anticipated expenses.
     (\$263,278.05)
  - 2. Submit new PI application for economic development technical assistance. (\$121,947.29)
- Guidance requested on use of remaining PI (\$473,000).
  - Put towards new PI project(s)
  - Or 2024 NOFA project(s)

PI applications will not count towards the Jan. NOFA.

#### **CDBG Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)**

- Staff also requests Board guidance on projects or eligible activities they wish to see developed for submission for the 2024 NOFA.
- When evaluating potential 2024 NOFA projects, important to also consider criteria beyond the CDBG program guidelines:
  - Which projects align best with the County's Strategic Plan?
  - Meet high-priority County needs?
  - Fulfill our community's needs?
- Staff will also solicit further community input via a public hearing in December/January per HCD's Public Participation Requirements.
- Staff will return to the board in January for final direction and approval on projects to be submitted to HCD for the 2024 NOFA.
