

SUMMARY

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 2.04, 2.28, 3.16, 8.69, 9.05, 9.40, AND 20.243 OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE PERTAINING TO THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND REPLACING COUNTY CODE REFERENCES TO “HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES AGENCY” WITH THE DEPARTMENTS OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH & RECOVERY SERVICES, PUBLIC HEALTH, AND/OR SOCIAL SERVICES

This Ordinance amends Chapter 2.28 of the Mendocino County Code pertaining to the duties and responsibilities of the Chief Executive Officer, in accordance with the Board of Supervisors’ approval on June 8, 2022, of the Ad Hoc Committee’s recommendation to schedule the Board and CEO’s joint review of all non-elected department heads at the first Board of Supervisors meeting of the calendar year and adding language reiterating the CEO’s responsibility for the roles of Clerk of the Board and Purchasing Agent, as reflected in Chapters 2.30 and 2.32. In addition, this Ordinance replaces all references to “Health and Human Services Agency” in the Mendocino County Code, within Chapters 2.04, 2.28, 3.16, 8.69, 9.05, 9.40, and 20.243, with appropriate references to the departments of Behavioral Health & Recovery Services, Public Health, and/or Social Services. Additional minor amendments are made to reflect departmental and position changes taking effect since the last revisions to the code.
