

The Mendocino County Department of Child Support Services had 2900 open cases as of September 30, 2023, serving both parents to ensure that their families receive court ordered financial and medical support.

#### **Executive Office**

During the June 6, 2023, Board of Supervisors meeting, the CEO was directed by General Consensus Of The Board to direct General Services Agency staff to report quarterly to the Board of Supervisors reduction in miles used by all departments and reduction in utilities used by all departments; direct the CEO and director of General Services Agency to return with a plan to the Board for facilities reduction with a developed team of department heads to report quarterly in the CEO's report.

During the June 20, 2023, Board of Supervisors meeting, the CEO was directed by General Consensus Of The Board to direct staff to publish a progress indicator on how many parcels have been assessed, the total dollar amount assessed, and staffing levels of appraisers in each Edition of the CEO Report, with a goal of closing the gap and reaching 85 percent (currently at or around 70 percent) over the next 24 months.

#### **Animal Services Agency**

The Animal Protection Unit worked 226 calls for service in September, with 65 calls being categorized as a priority such as "biting animals,

cruelty complaints, animals in distress, aggressive loose animals and Law Enforcement assist."

## Behavioral Health & Recovery Services

Behavioral Health & Recovery Services recognizes October as National Substance Misuse Prevention Month. October was first declared as National Substance Misuse Prevention Month in 2011. #### **Environmental Health**

On October 2, 2023, a damaged sailing vessel was found adrift off the coast of Mendocino, prompting a Coast Guard rescue. After the sailor was saved, a strong odor led to our hazardous materials team being called in. The team found elevated carbon monoxide levels and a jug of fiberglass resin which was likely causing the odor. All hazards were addressed by Mendocino County REHIT, and the vessel was returned back to the Coast Guard. REHIT (Redwood Empire Hazardous Incident Team) works closely with many State and local agencies to respond to threats of hazardous

material releases in Mendocino County. When immediate threats to the public and environment are mitigated, Environmental Health (EH) steps in to make sure contaminates are cleaned up in a safe and complete manner. Will Nalty splits his time as a hazardous materials health inspector, here in EH, when not managing the REHIT program.

#### **General Services Agency**

The General Services Agency, Facilities Division is charged with routine and emergency maintenance, utility payments, custodial services, and grounds-keeping responsibilities for all county-owned and several leased facilities. Other responsibilities include project management for larger-scale deferred maintenance projects and maintenance of all county-owned parks and recreational areas. 

#### **Social Services**

With the resumption of the Medi-Cal redetermination process, the Medi-Cal caseload administered by Mendocino County Department of Social Services has begun to see a decrease in numbers. If someone in your household currently receives Medi-Cal coverage, please be on the lookout for your annual renewal packet. This renewal packet should arrive in a bright yellow envelope and must be completed to avoid discontinuance of coverage. In the same time period (4/2022-9/2023) as the chart above, Mendocino County Department of Social Services Family & Children's Services (FCS) had 177 case closures. The FCS division continues to support family reunification whenever possible while maintaining child safety.

Non Relative Legal Guardianship: payment-only cases with social worker checkins every 6 months.

Emergency Response: initial case opening while assessing further case status.

Family Maintenance: children ages 0-17 who are under the supervision of Family & Children's Services and Juvenile Court but are living with a parent.

Family Reunification: children ages 0-17 who are under the supervision of Family & Children's Services and Juvenile Court and are in foster care while one or both parents are engaged in reunification services.

<u>Permanency Placement:</u> children ages 0-17 who are under the supervision of Family & Children's Services and Juvenile Court and are in long term foster care, some are awaiting legal guardianship or adoption finalization. <u>Supportive Transition:</u> young adults ages 18-21 who were in foster care when turning 18 and voluntarily remain under the supervision of Family & Children's Services and Juvenile Court.

## **Animal Services Agency**

During the month of September, 577 dog licenses were sold resulting in \$21,677 in revenue.

#### **Child Support Services**

During the month of September, the Mendocino County Department of Child Support Services collected and distributed \$619,412.63 in court-ordered child support payments, and a total of 684 children are currently enrolled in employer-offered medical coverage. A single collection of \$167,000 was distributed to five different families.

County Emergency Services (OES) Staff attended the Listos California Regional Disaster Ready Summit in Santa Rosa on Monday, September 18, 2023. The summit discussed how to help vulnerable Californians prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters. Various State, Local, and Non-governmental partners attended the conference where they were empowered to deliver culturally congruent education as well as connect and learn from each other's work and experiences. The summit gave local agencies an opportunity to collaborate with non-governmental organizations and discuss how they can work together to reach vulnerable communities that historically haven't benefited from such intention and attention. ### Prevention, Recovery, Resiliency, and Mitigation Division

The Prevention, Recovery, Resiliency, and Mitigation Division (PRRM) has concluded the first round of public listening sessions to

gather input on the resilience needs of communities around Mendocino County. The input collected will be collated and used to help drive the focus of the grants team to help plug gaps in the resilience and preparedness of communities across the County. PRRM in partnership with the County Office of Emergency Services is working to get individuals prepared for disasters as we enter another winter season. PRRM will be assisting County OES in signing individuals up for emergency alerts and distributing preparedness information at the Fire and Safety Expo at Pumpkinfest in Ukiah on October 14, 2023.

(2)Registered Veterinary Technician positions due to an employee moving out of state and an employee retiring. This has caused the Animal Shelter's Clinic to primarily focus on only performing spay & primarily focus on only performing spay & and neuter surgeries for the shelter animals.

Due to the vacancies, the Animal Shelter is not in a position to assist the animal rescue organizations and citizens in performing spay & and neuter surgeries at this time.
