Median household income is \$12.6K below the national median household income of \$69.0K.


Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 4.5% since 2018, growing by 3,937. Population is expected to increase by 8.5% between 2023 and 2028, adding 7,739.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs declined by 3.2% in Mendocino County, CA from 38,901 to 37,639. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.6% by 6.8%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 57.0% to 50.2% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.2% of Mendocino County, CA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.9% below the national average), and **8.5% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.5% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Individual and Family Services.








Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends






Mendocino County, CA had a September 2023 unemployment rate of 4.55%, increasing from 4.01% 5 years before.





Millennials


Mendocino County, CA has 14,824 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 18,256.




Retirement risk is high in Mendocino County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 26,906 people 55 or older, while there are 33,612 here.










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP






Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation Employment Concentration


Top Occupation Earnings









Educational Pipeline

In 2022, there were 646 graduates in Mendocino County, CA. This pipeline has grown by 56% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Health/Medical Preparatory Programs, Other" (Associate's), "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Certificate), and "Business Administration and Management, General" (Associate's).
