

We recruit youth, maintain enrollments in youth groups, organize youth activities, and support youth through advocacy, training, and meaningful community activities. Mendocino County has limited LGBTQ2S+ population and substance use rates data. Census and service data collection does not include extensive sexuality and gender identity spectrum data. Programs have received feedback that stigma or fear of how data is used impacts responses. Mendocino County LGBTQ2S+ youth focus-groups identify health disparities felt by the LGBTQ2S+ population can be explained by stressors induced by a hostile and homophobic culture. This impacts individual willingness to self-identify as LGBQ2S+.

Mendocino County will engage in continuous review and quality improvement to evaluate our program by monitoring our quarterly outcome metrics. We will continuously collect feedback from stakeholders in existing prevention activities (specifically youth groups and opioid coalition) for ongoing feedback on successes and the need to improve the campaign activities. We will internally review our success in completing deliverables each quarter, and use that feedback to adjust, adapt, and improve implementation efforts. We will conduct a survey of attitudes and awareness at the beginning and the end of our media campaign efforts. We will consult with LGBTQ2S+ stakeholder groups and experts for input on improvements. Mendocino County has three positions assigned to Substance Use Prevention activities: a Program Administrator, a Program Specialist I/II, fiscal analyst support, and a VISTA. Mendocino County will leverage existing partnerships with Opioid coalition partners and will engage new partners for additional diversity and expertise with the LGBTQ2S+community.

Mendocino County works persistently to identify and address underlying social and familial factors that prompt youth and adults to substance use. Cultural competency is reflected in our Substance Use Disorder Prevention Program

The issue of sustainability threads throughout this project. Identifying existing community-based programs and examining the strengths and weaknesses of county programs offers directions for developing strategies that will provide the highest impact/results in relation to cost-effectiveness for the community. For example, building upon existing successful programs is one tactic to enhance the sustainability of prevention programs. In addition, any capacity gaps have to be considered when developing SUD prevention strategies. Finally, finding ways to partner with existing organizations and utilize their expertise will increase impact as well as sustainability.
