Abstract

Friday Night Live aims to provide a safe and healthy alternative for youth when substance abuse and mental health issues are most prevalent. The program will be offered in collaboration with local schools, community organizations, and law enforcement to provide a comprehensive approach to reducing substance abuse and promoting mental health among California's youth.

The program will consist of various activities including recreational sports, music, arts and cultural activities, as well as educational workshops on substance abuse prevention and mental health. The program will also provide youth with access to counseling and support services.

The grant application requests funding to support the costs of program activities, including staff salaries, equipment and supplies, and transportation. According to data from the California Department of Public Health, Black and Latinx youth are disproportionately affected by opioid and stimulant misuse. For example, in 2019, the opioid overdose death rate among Black youth was nearly 2 times higher than the rate among White youth. Additionally, Latinx youth have a higher rate of stimulant misuse than their non-Latinx peers.

Another subpopulation that the program will serve is youth and young adults who are experiencing poverty and social economic disadvantage. These young people are more likely to be exposed to trauma, have limited access to healthcare, and lack access to safe and stable housing, which can increase the risk of substance abuse. Additionally,

data shows that young people in poverty are more likely to be involved in the criminal justice system, which can further exacerbate their substance abuse problems.

Language and cultural considerations are also important when working with the target population. The YOR California project will serve youth and young adults who speak languages other than English as their primary language. According to the California Health Interview Survey, in Mendocino county, around 20% of the population speaks Spanish and around 3% speaks other languages than English. Therefore, the program will provide services in multiple languages to ensure that all youth can access and benefit from the program.

The YOR California project will also take into account the cultural considerations of the target population. This includes understanding and respecting the cultural beliefs, values, and practices that may influence their substance abuse behaviors and treatment preferences. For example, some youth may prefer traditional healing practices or may have cultural beliefs that affect their attitudes towards seeking help.

In terms of community assets, Mendocino County has a strong network of community-based organizations that provide services to youth and families. These organizations offer a range of services, including youth development programs, counseling, and substance abuse treatment. However, there are also service gaps that need to be addressed, such as limited access to mental health services, lack of culturally appropriate services, and limited access to medication-assisted treatment for opioid use disorder.

In conclusion, the target population for the YOR California project is youth and young adults who are misusing opioids and stimulants. The program will take into account the community assets and service gaps that affects the target population.

Program Design and Services Narrative

a. The lasting impact that YOR California will make through this project is to reduce the negative consequences of opioid and stimulant misuse among youth and young adults in Mendocino County. The program's goal is to create a safe and positive environment for youth with Friday Night Live, which will ultimately reduce youth involvement in crime and substance abuse.

To achieve this goal, the program will have several measurable objectives that will be tracked and evaluated over time.

- 1. Increase the number of youth and Young Adults participating in Friday Night Live activities: This objective will be measured by tracking the number of youth and young adults who attend Friday Night Live events and participate in activities such as music, sports, and arts.
- 2. Reduce the number of youth and young adults who engage in substance abuse: This objective will be measured by tracking the number of youth and young adults who report using opioids and stimulants before and after participating in the Friday Night Live program.
- 3. Increase the number of youth and young adults who receive substance abuse treatment: This objective will be measured by tracking the number of youth and young adults who receive substance abuse treatment services, such as counseling or medication-assisted treatment, as a result of participating in the Friday Night Live program.
- 4. Improve the cultural competence of volunteers and employees: This objective will be measured by conducting pre and post-training assessments to evaluate the cultural competence of volunteers and employees, and tracking the number of volunteers and employees who receive cultural competence training.
- 5. Increase community engagement and support: This objective will be measured by tracking the number of community members who attend Friday Night Live events and the level of support and engagement from community-based organizations and local government agencies.

By achieving these objectives, YOR California will have a lasting impact on reducing the negative consequences of opioid and stimulant misuse among youth and young adults in Mendocino County and creating a safer and more positive environment for young people with Friday Night Live.

b. Expanding access to services for underserved youth and young adults misusing opioids and stimulants is a critical step in addressing the opioid epidemic in our community.
