PROCLAMATION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES PROCLAIMING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE FEBRUARY 2023 WINTER STORMS EVENT

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630 and Mendocino County Code section 7.04.050 empowers the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when said county is affected, or likely to be affected, by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session, subject to ratification by the Board of Supervisors within seven days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the County of Mendocino has been subjected to severe winter storms commencing on February 21, 2023; and

WHEREAS, winter storm conditions of high winds, cold weather, rain, and low elevation snow caused severe ground saturation, unstable hillsides, downed trees, and power outages; and

WHEREAS, the winter storm caused significant impact to the County, community operations, and resources and require the provision of additional public safety, health, and emergency services; and

WHEREAS, the condition of extreme peril caused numerous road closures due to debris, downed trees, downed power lines, and power outages; and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services hereby proclaims that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within Mendocino County as of February 21, 2023 due to continued winter storm conditions of high winds, cold weather, rain, and low elevation snow, and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services now proclaims that a local emergency exists in Mendocino County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services proclaims that:

- 1. Conditions of extreme peril to safety of persons and property have arisen within Mendocino County due to the February 2023 Winter Storm event.
- 2. As a consequence of said conditions and pursuant to Government Code section 8630 and Mendocino County Code section 7.04.050, a local emergency now exists in Mendocino County due to the February 2023 Winter Storm event.
- 3. During this local emergency the powers, functions and duties of the Mendocino County Chief Executive Officer and the emergency organization of Mendocino County shall be those prescribed by State law, and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved emergency services plans of the County of Mendocino.
- 4. This proclamation shall be submitted to the Director of the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services requesting a Director's Concurrence as well as making California Disaster Act Assistance and all applicable state funding and resources available to the County, and seek all available forms of disaster assistance and relief programs, including a request for a Presidential Declaration

of a Major Disaster, Public Assistance, Individual Assistance, and USDA Disaster Assistance Programs.

PROCLAMATION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES PROCLAIMING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE DECEMBER 2022 TO JANUARY 2023 WINTER STORMS EVENT

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630 and Mendocino County Code section 7.04.050 empowers the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when said county is affected, or likely to be affected, by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session, subject to ratification by the Board of Supervisors within seven days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the County of Mendocino has been subjected to severe winter storms commencing on December 27, 2022; and

WHEREAS, starting in late December 2022, severe winter storms began to impact a large area of Northern California. After several weeks of ongoing rain, a particularly severe storm bought heavy rain and high winds to the region. Following the prolonged storm impacts, soils are near-saturated to saturated; creeks, streams, and rivers are reaching or exceeding flood stage; low-lying areas are experiencing flooding, including inundation of low road crossings; there is ponding of water on roadways; and there is an increased risk of rocks and other sediment dislodging from hillsides; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. National Weather Service forecasted up to 20 inches of precipitation over the next seventeen days before December 27, 2022; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous road closures due to debris, downed trees, and downed power lines; and

WHEREAS, severe storm along with moderate to high winds continues to forecast over Mendocino County; and

WHEREAS, the hazardous weather conditions will likely result in downed trees, localized flooding, roadway impediments, and debris flows; and

WHEREAS, the Russian River at Hopland and Navarro River are likely to surpass the flood stage conditions; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Mendocino County depend on the availability of the County's response systems for safety; and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services hereby proclaims that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within Mendocino County as of December 27 due to heavy rains, saturated ground, and high tides, which have toppled trees, washed out County roads, and washed out creek banks, endangering public infrastructure, and caused other damage and impacts; and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services now proclaims that a local emergency exists in Mendocino County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mendocino County Director of Emergency Services proclaims that:

- 1. Conditions of extreme peril to safety of persons and property have arisen within Mendocino County due to the December 2022 to January 2023 Winter Storm event.
- 2. As a consequence of said conditions and pursuant to Government Code section 8630 and Mendocino County Code section 7.04.050, a local emergency now exists in Mendocino County due to the January 2023 Winter Storm event.
- 3. During this local emergency the powers, functions and duties of the Mendocino County Chief Executive Officer and the emergency organization of Mendocino County shall be those prescribed by State law, and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved emergency services plans of the County of Mendocino.
- 4. This proclamation shall be submitted to the Director of the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services requesting a Director's Concurrence as well as making California Disaster Act Assistance and all applicable state funding and resources available to the County, and seek all available forms of disaster assistance and relief programs, including a request for a Presidential Declaration of a Major Disaster, Public Assistance, Individual Assistance, and USDA Disaster Assistance Programs.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) hereby gives notice to the public of its intent to reimburse eligible applicants for eligible costs to repair or replace facilities within their authority and jurisdiction which were damaged as a result of:

California Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides, incident period of December 27, 2022 – January 31, 2023, under the major disaster declaration FEMA-4683-DR-CA, signed by the President on January 14th, 2023;

California Severe Winter Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides, incident period of February 21, 2023 – July 10, 2023, under the major disaster declaration FEMA-4699-DR-CA, signed by the President on April 3rd, 2023;

California Tropical Storm Hilary, incident period of August 19, 2023 – August 21, 2023, under the major disaster declaration FEMA-4750-DR-CA, signed by the President on November 21st, 2023;

and California Severe Winter Storms, Tornadoes, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides, incident period of Jan 31, 2024 – Feb 9, 2024, under the major disaster declaration FEMA-4769-DR-CA, signed by the President on April 13th, 2024.

Initial disaster-wide Public Notices were published on September 11, 2023, for DR-4683 California Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides; on November 1, 2023, for DR-4699 California Severe Winter Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides; on December 27, 2023, for DR-4750 California Tropical Storm Hilary; and on April 13, 2024, for DR-4769 California Severe Winter Storms, Tornadoes, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives. Additionally, Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990 require all federal actions in or affecting the floodplain or wetlands be reviewed for opportunities to relocate and evaluated for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. Where there is no opportunity to relocate, FEMA is required to undertake a detailed review to determine what measures may be taken to minimize future damages, to consider alternatives, and provide a public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 promotes nondiscrimination in federal programs that affect human health and the environment and requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority and low-income populations.

This notice may also fulfill requirements under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The NHPA requires federal agencies to take into account the effect of their undertakings on historic properties. Those actions or activities affecting buildings, structures, districts or objects 50 years or older or that affect archeological sites or undisturbed ground will require further review to determine if the property is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (Register). If the property is determined to be eligible for the Register and FEMA's undertaking will adversely

affect it, FEMA will provide additional public notices. For historic properties not adversely affected by FEMA's undertaking, this will be the only public notice.

The Rehabilitation Act of 1973 protects the civil rights of persons with disabilities. It prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by the federal government, federal contractors, and by recipients of federal financial assistance. Any recipient or sub-recipient of federal funds is required to make their programs accessible to individuals with disabilities. Its protections apply to all programs and businesses that receive any federal funds. This applies to all elements of physical/architectural, programmatic and communication accessibility in all services and activities conducted by or funded by FEMA. FEMA intends to comply with the Rehabilitation Act in all federally conducted and assisted programs in alignment with the principals of whole community inclusion and universal accessibility.

This notice serves as a cumulative final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain and wetlands. This notice applies to the Public Assistance (PA) program implemented under the authority of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 5121-5207. This notice is to inform the public of FEMA's intent to allocate grant funds to State, local, and tribal governments, as well as non-profit organizations for the repair or replacement of facilities within designated areas susceptible to flooding. These flood zones include A & AE-Zones, which are areas susceptible to a 1% annual chance of flooding up to the Base Flood Elevation (BFE). Shaded X-Zones, which are areas susceptible to 0.2% annual chance of flooding, are considered with respect to critical actions (actions for which even the slightest chance of flooding is too great). This does not cover actions that are located in the floodway or coastal high hazard area. In all cases, FEMA has followed the 8-step process laid out in 44 CFR Part 9 to determine the overall effect of projects within these areas and this notice shall only pertain to those projects which were determined to be practicable.

For Special Flood Hazard Areas (A & AE-Zones), this notice represents those projects that require the full 8-step process as set forth in 44 C.F.R. Part 9 and in which the function is not otherwise served by a more practicable alternative. For these types of projects, relocation or abandonment of the facilities would cause adverse social and economic impacts to the local community. Flood risk will be minimized by all practicable means and projects will not adversely affect the floodplain or wetlands.

This notice does not apply to projects that:

- (A) are bridge projects over \$100,000 (each individual site); or
- (B) cost more than 50% to restore the facility [44 CFR Part 9.5(d)(2) and (d)(4)]; or
- (C) are in the floodway or coastal high hazard areas; or
- (D) are construction of temporary access road(s); or
- (E) are projects that require a Hydraulic and Hydrologic (H&H) study; or
- (F) projects that include mitigation measures; except for upgrades for current codes and standards and/or least cost alternatives.







Below is a map of the Declared Counties.


FEMA-4683-DR-CA:
