Mission

The mission of United Disaster Relief of Northern California (UDRNC) is to support the full recovery of people who have been impacted by a disaster. To further this mission, UDRNC offers immediate and long term relief to anyone impacted by a disaster by providing advocacy, resources, and material goods and by assisting people to access all available resources to help them rebuild, remodel, rent or relocate, and ultimately recover after their disaster. UDRNC also assists other disaster resource centers in Northern California.

Fiscally Sponsored by NCO, we are Non Profit & Volunteer Run

- Over 3,000 Clients Served Locally in the last year Feb. 2021 - Feb. 2022
- Served and Delivered Supplies Across several Counties in Northern California
- Over 100 Volunteers in the last year have helped at UDRNC
- Volunteers have donated over 4,000 hours of time
- UDRNC has accepted over 30 semis, with most trucks valued over \$100,000 in donated goods, with delivery costs waived
- 5 volunteers forklift operator certified
- 10 volunteers food safety certified
- UDRNC has helped with over 30 disasters in Northern California
- Helped with over 16 disasters county wide
- Attended 2 Local Assistant Centers & 3 Emergency Preparedness Booths
- Partners with Red Cross, Catholic Charities, UMCOR, Buddhist Tzu CHI Foundation, NCO, American Red Cross amongst others.
- Volunteers with UDRNC helped install over 60 mailboxes, built and delivered over 60 garden boxes with soil and plants, and fundraised for 13 large childrens playhouses
- UDRNC organized and hosted 5 Adopt a Fire Survivor Christmas Events - Raised over \$50,000 in gifts for fire survivors






Exposure to 500-Year Flood by Region By Hydrologic Region




Natural Disaster vs Man-Made Disaster

A **natural disaster** is when events such as earthquakes, mudslides, floods or wildfires affect people. Despite our inability to control these events, we can plan and prepare for them to minimize damage when they do happen.

A **man-made disaster** results from man-made hazards (threats having an element of human intent, negligence or error, or involving a failure of a man-made system). They differ from natural disasters that result from natural hazards.

UDRNC offers many resources within the center including case management, advocacy, laundry room, massage room, office room, store, furniture and a place to eat after a long day.


Resource Room

SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

Working in the wake of wildfires and other disasters, United Disaster Relief of Northern California (UDRNC) is focused on helping Mendocino County's vulnerable disaster survivors, as well as supporting disaster-impacted people throughout Northern California. UDRNC receives support and donated materials from across the country, demonstrating the trust that donors place in our organization. These donated material goods mean that disaster survivors can save their money for rebuilding, repairing, renting, and recovery.

Our center and team of volunteers have assisted with over 30 wildfires, individual structure fires, PSPS events, floods, snowstorms, as well as the COVID-19 pandemic, and we have distributed the donated contents of more than 20 semis, supporting thousands of disaster survivors. Currently, we have the capacity to accept up to four semi-truck deliveries a month, with each load valued at thousands of dollars in new items.

We have launched our Heart of Gold Campaign to raise the \$250k needed to secure the purchase of our Ukiah facility in 2022, making it possible for us to continue to operate out of this building for years to come. Your sponsorship goes a long way as we work to sustain and grow our capacity to serve the community.
