11-22/16 SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDNANCE

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18.16 OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE RELATING TO THE COUNTY'S MASTER GRID AND PROPERTY NUMBERING SYSTEM

This ordinance is amending Chapter 18.16 of the Mendocino County Code to provide clarification and definition to existing property addressing processes and to eliminate outdated or irrelevant sections. Changes in-clude clarifying east/west and north/south address base lines; allowing discretion for addressing unimproved parcels; clarify-ing the process used to deter-mine the address range for a road and how numbers are assigned; limiting property num-bers to whole numbers only with limited exceptions; requiring posted road signs for private roads; requiring roads to serve four dwellings and/or business establishments rather than four parcels for road name petitions; designating the Address Coordinator as the system administra-tor, instead of the Building Inspector; amending the penalty provisions; as well as renumbering sections for clarity and making minor technical amendments.

The proposed ordinance is scheduled for adoption on December 6, 2016.
