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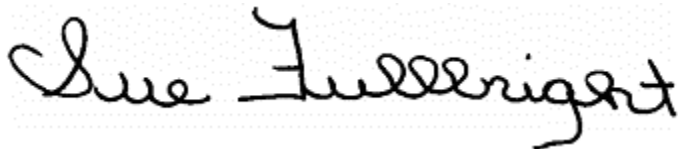

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE CREATING CHAPTER 1.08 OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE ESTABLISHING A PROCEDURE TO ISSUE ADMINISTRATIVE CITATIONS AND IMPOSE ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES FOR ANY VIOLATION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE

This ordinance is creating Mendocino County Code Chapter 1.08 for the purpose of deterring code violations and obtaining code compliance by establishing an alternate code enforcement procedure applicable to any violation of the Mendocino County Code. Provisions include: a procedure for an authorized code enforcement officer to issue administrative citations for code violations, along with increasing administrative penalties for repeat or uncorrected violations; an administrative appeal process, heard by a hearing officer, to challenge the citation and penalty; specific rules applicable to the administrative appeal hearing, hearing officer, and administrative order; a recognized right to judicial review of the administrative decision; and enforcement mechanisms available to the County if the penalties are not paid.

The proposed ordinance is scheduled for adoption on January 10, 2017.

A complete copy of the ordinance is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the Public Records Act.
