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

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ADDING SECTION 3.04.150 OF CHAPTER 3.04 OF TITLE 3 OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE ENTITLED "VACATION LEAVE WITH PAY"

Section 3.04.150(G) Vacation Termination Pay currently prohibits a terminating employee from being re-employed for compensation in any capacity until the total number of working days of accrued vacation have elapsed. The intent of modifying this ordinance is to allow a terminating employee to be re-employed in an extra-help capacity without waiting for total number of working days of accrued vacation to elapse. This provides a mechanism for a department head to re-employee the terminating employee on a temporary basis in the interim of filling the position with a regular appointment, provide on-call coverage during planned and unplanned absences, or to provide training to a new incumbent. The ordinance amendment would take effect thirty (30) days following final adoption by the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors. The proposed ordinance is scheduled for adoption on January 10, 2017.

A complete copy of the ordinance is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the Public Records Act.
