

Please do not raise the speed limit through Philo to 45 mph from 30 mph. The area in question has residents and tourists alike crossing the road frequently, to access tasting rooms, Lemon's Market, and the Post Office. Most out of town motorists do not need the current 30 mph limit, and to increase it to 45 mph will only make matters worse! It is extremely dangerous to increase speeds on this section of road and threaten lives daily. This is in regards to Caltrans considering raising the speed limits through Philo in Anderson Valley.

For those of us living here, many of our homes were built before 128 was installed. The valley is residential.

The electronic speed light before Philo is helpful. But to raise that to 45 mph is dangerous for anyone trying to exit or enter 128 to get home, for anyone trying to cross 128 to get to PO or market, as well as for the tipsy wine tasters. We have few community resources of stores and post offices. We need to be able to access them safely.

The speed limit of 50 mph coming out of Boonville is dangerous for anyone trying to turn onto side streets to get to and from our homes as well.
