 - Those having a primary night time residence not meant for human habitation



Count of Individuals and Families Experiencing Homelessness

- ☐ 28% Coast
- 22% Inland North
- □ 50% Inland South



Survey and Data Points

- One-on-one interviews conducted by homeless workers and volunteers
 - Example of 21 HUD mandated questions asked
 - □ Length of Time of Experiencing Homeless
 - Military Service
 - Age, Ethnicity and Race
 - □ Physical, Mental and Emotional Health Conditions
 - □ Specific Medical Needs

Incentives and Compensation

- Compensation:
 - Paid only to workers who were currently experiencing or that had formerly experienced homelessness.
 - □ \$10/hour on day of count
 - \$5 Safeway's Healthy Heart gift card for each completed survey turned in during the following 6 days of the count
- Incentives:
 - Survey Respondents received a \$5 Safeway Healthy Heart Gift Card gift card for completing the survey

Before the Count

- Planning Meetings
- Create New/Update forms
 - Surveys
 - Observational Tool
 - Budget tracking
 - Incentive Disbursement
- Volunteer trainings



Coast Specifics

- 15 volunteers and individuals experiencing homelessness participated in the count
- Westport to Boonville and Gualala and inland to Parlin Fork
- 89 Surveys Completed
- Evidence of recent activity in many locations but not many people found

Inland Specifics (North & South)


- 48 volunteers and individuals experiencing homelessness participated in the count
- Piercy to Hopland and Potter Valley west to Reeves Canyon Road
- 176 Surveys Completed
- Need more homeless workers participating in the count

Observations


- Warming Centers were Effective
- □ Fences Limited Access
- Increased Encampment
- Volunteers are Essential

Chronically Homeless

HUD's DEFINITION: A person who is "chronically homeless" is an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition and who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years.

Self reporting survey count for 2017 is 110 Individuals.
