

#### SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 15.12.040(B) OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE - ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 15.04.030(F) OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY CODE - SPEED ZONING ON COUNTY ROADS, ADDING PARAGRAPH 15.04.030(F) (11), ESTABLISHING A FORTY-FIVE MILES PER HOUR PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMIT ON POINT CABRILLO DRIVE, COUNTY ROAD 564, FROM MILEPOST 0.00 TO MILEPOST 0.75 (CASPAR AREA) AND CLARIFYING AND CORRECTING ROAD NUMBERS AND REPEALING A PREVIOUSLY VACATED ROAD

This Ordinance amends Chapter 15.04.030(F) of the Mendocino County Code by establishing a forty-five miles per hour speed zone on Point Cabrillo Drive, (CR564), from milepost 0.00 to milepost 0.75. Currently these roads have no posted speed limit. In addition, this Ordinance corrects an incorrect road number and adds missing road numbers, as well as repeals a previously vacated road.

The Ordinance shall become operative upon approval by a majority vote of the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors and the posting of the required signs.

The proposed ordinance is scheduled for adoption on August 1, 2017.

A complete copy of the ordinance is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the Public Records Act.
