AN ORDINANCE ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 6.36 - CAN-NABIS FACILITIES AND CHAPTER 20.243 - MEDICAL AND ADULT USE CANNABIS FACILITIES

It is proposed to add two new chapters to the Mendocino County Code: (1) Chapter 6.36—Cannabis Facilities, of the Mendocino County Business License Code, which will be administered by the County Treasurer - Tax Collector Department; and (2) Chapter 20.243—Medical and Adult Use Cannabis Facilities, of the Mendocino County Inland Zoning Ordinance (Mendocino County Code, Title 20, Division I), which will be administered by the Department of Planning and Building Services (PBS). Chapter 20.243 will regulate land use and zoning to ensure that the location and scale of processing, manufacturing, testing, retailing/dispensing, and distributing, of cannabis is compatible with the County's land use and environmental setting, establish permit requirements for certain cannabis businesses, and require compliance with environmental and public health regulations. Chapter 6.36 will require business licenses and annual renewals for businesses engaging in commercial processing, manufacturing, testing, retailing/dispensing, and distributing of cannabis.
