RE: Williams Settlement Annual Report to Mendocino County Board of Supervisors

Dear Supervisor Hamburg,

Pursuant to Education Code 1240, I am officially notifying the County Board of Supervisors of my findings regarding site visits for Decile 1-3 schools in Mendocino County. As you know, the ACLU filed a class action suit against the State of California which indicated that the state had failed to provide poor and underprivileged students with equal educational opportunities (AKA: *Williams Settlement*). The specific elements of the lawsuit included inadequate school facilities, insufficient educational materials, and a lack of fully-credentialed teachers.

I am pleased to inform you that in August and September of 2017, the MCOE *Williams* Site Review Team conducted another year of visits to school sites. Each site visit was a positive and professional experience, characterized by a collaborative focus on improving student achievement to ensure equal educational opportunities for all children in Mendocino County.

## **General Statistics**

Of the 12 school districts in Mendocino County, eight districts have one or more Decile 1-3 schools in their district. The County Superintendent of Schools or a designee(s) visited all 15 of the Decile 1-3 schools to review instructional materials, facilities, quarterly uniform complaint reports, and teacher misassignments and vacancies.

## **Teacher Misassignments & Vacancies**

During the 2016-2017 school year, there were fifty-three teachers (one at Anderson Valley Elementary, three at Laytonville Elementary, eight at Arena Union Elementary, one at Point Arena High, one at Calpella Elementary, eleven at Eagle Peak Middle School, one at Grace Hudson Elementary, one at Nokomis Elementary, two at Oak Manor Elementary, twenty-two at Pomolita Middle School, one at Blosser Lane Elementary, and one at Willits High) who lacked the appropriate authorization for their assignment. All assignments were rectified by reassignment, retirement, or applications for appropriate credentials within 30 calendar days. 2017-2018 teacher misassignments and vacancies are monitored throughout the year and will be summarized in next year's letter to the Board of Supervisors.

## **Facilities Review**

As a result of the site reviews, it was determined that the majority of Mendocino County Schools are in overall good repair. There were no findings from the 15 site visits that qualified as one of the "eight emergency repair situations that poses an emergency or urgent threat to the health and safety of students or staff." Of the fifteen schools, twelve received a "good" rating and three received a "fair" rating. A list of findings for each school is included in this report. All districts have received a copy of the Superintendent's findings.

**Exemplary:** The school meets most or all standards of good repair. Deficiencies noted, if any, are not significant and/or impact a very small area of the school.

**Good:** The school is maintained in good repair with a number of non-critical deficiencies noted. These deficiencies are isolated, and/or resulting from minor wear and tear, and/or in the process of being mitigated.

**Fair:** The school is not in good repair. Some deficiencies noted are critical and/or widespread. Repairs and/or additional maintenance are necessary in several areas of the school site.

# **Quarterly Uniform Complaints**

Quarterly, MCOE receives uniform complaint forms from each of the twelve Mendocino County School Districts. The quarterly reports indicate if any complaints have been filed at the district office in the areas of textbooks and instructional materials, teacher vacancy or misassignments, facilities and California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) Intensive Instruction and Services and the LCAP (Local Control Accountability Plan). During the 2016-2017 academic year, there were no *Williams* complaints filed with any of the districts in the county.

## **SARC (School Accountability Report Card)**

The SARCs for all 15 schools were monitored for the accuracy of two *Williams* Settlement components included on the report card, *sufficiency of instructional materials* and *status of school facilities*. Inaccuracies noted were reported on the third quarter report to the district superintendents.
