#### BACKGROUND

The Ukiah Rod & Gun Club is a California non-profit corporation dedicated to the conservation, propagation and protection of wildlife, livestock and fisheries in Mendocino County and the State of California.

#### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The Ukiah Rod & Gun Club proposes to continue its expanded Sacramento Pike Minnow Abatement Program which it supported by F&G Section 13103 (h).

The Ukiah Rod & Gun Club is presently conducting a Sacramento Pike Minnow Abatement Program. It has found many wild yearling Steelhead Trout in the stomach of larger pike minnow. These yearlings Steelhead are our wild two-year-olds. They are the result of our programs in which we planted large adult Steelhead in the headwaters of the tributaries to the Russian River to spawn. These yearlings Steelhead move down creeks to the Russian River, where large numbers are being eaten by the Pike Minnow. If these predators are captured, we believe the young salmon, which are presently being eaten, will survive.

Since the Ukiah Rod & Gun Club started this program, two anadromous fish, the Chinook Salmon, and the Steelhead, have been listed as "threatened" under the Endangered Species Act.

The Coho Salmon has been listed as "endangered" at both the Federal level and at the State level. The Sacramento Pike Minnow are known to eat young Chinook as well as the Steelhead. Because of the success of our program other counties such as Sonoma and Lake, and organizations in the Eel River watershed, are now initiating similar programs. It is environmentally safe and does not affect any other species.

To encourage people to catch the pike minnow we are offering a drawing worth at least \$3.00 or \$5.00 each for every fish caught over 10 inches in length. We teach and encourage the youth of Mendocino County to learn proper sportsmanship through educational programs and use this program as a means to continue their education.

This program has been in existence for eighteen (22) years. We originally felt it would take at least five years for-this program to be effective. Since the inception of our program, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife has initiated new regulations in the Russian River which greatly inhibits the ability to catch these pike minnow. Some of these new regulations decrease the fishing season and eliminate the use of bait. This has made it difficult for youth to participate because they cannot fish during their summer vacation. The program is a success, but needs to continue if we are going to stay ahead of the predation problem.

This program now extends to Lake Mendocino and into the East Fork of the Russian River in Potter Valley. Because of the extension of the program additional funds are needed. Also, we have not applied for any funding since 2010. Since that time the Club has been supporting the program by membership and donations. It is extremely important to continue this program if we are going to see any successful recovery of the listed species. The Ukiah Rod & Gun Club is asking for\$5000 in funding for this program.
