

RESOLUTION NO. 18- 057

RESOLUTION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REAFFIRMING THE EXISTENCE OF LOCAL HEALTH EMERGENCY AS PROCLAIMED BY THE HEALTH OFFICER

WHEREAS, the California Health and Safety Code, Division 101, Part 3, Chapter 2, commencing with §101075 confers upon Local Health Officers of the political subdivisions of this state emergency powers necessary to protect public health and safety;

WHEREAS, §101080 of the California Health and Safety Code, states that "the local health officer may declare a local health emergency in the jurisdiction or any area thereof" affected by hazardous waste which is an imminent threat to the public health;

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code Section 101080 empowers the local health officer to proclaim the existence of a local health emergency when this county or any area of the county is affected or likely to be affected by such a public health threat while the Board of Supervisors is not in session, which shall expire if not ratified by the Board of Supervisors within seven days and is subject to review every 14 days thereafter until such local health emergency is terminated, though such 14-day review requirement has been waived by the Governor of the State of California pursuant to Executive Order B-45-17;

WHEREAS, on October 13, 2017, the local health officer of the County of Mendocino issued a declaration of local health emergency due to the hazardous debris generated by the Redwood Complex Fire;

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2017, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino ratified the declaration of local health emergency by the local health officer due to the hazardous debris generated by the Redwood Complex Fire; and

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2017, November 14, 2017, November 21, 2017, December 5, 2017, December 19, 2017, January 9, 2018, February 6, 2018, February 27, 2018, March 27, 2018, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino adopted Resolution Nos. 17-154, 17-167, 17-173, 17-179, 17-195, 18-007, 18-020, 18-030, and 18-043 respectively, reaffirming the existence of a local health emergency due to the hazardous debris generated by the Redwood Complex Fire.




The foregoing Resolution introduced by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Supervisor Gjerde, and carried this 24th day of April, 2018, by the following vote:


