#### **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING for the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors Consideration to Approve Funding Applications to the Economic Development Administration (EDA) for the Disaster Supplemental Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors will conduct a public hearing on **Tuesday, June 19, 2018, at 9:00 a.m.** or soon thereafter at the Board Chambers, 501 Low Gap Road, Ukiah, CA 95482 to discuss two funding applications to the Economic Development Administration (EDA) for the Disaster Supplemental Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) and to solicit citizen input. Because the EDA funds are limited, and the application process is competitive, it is in the interest of the County to pursue these funds as soon as possible.

The purpose of this public hearing is to give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known regarding the two applications under the EDA-2018-Disaster Supplemental, which requires a 20% match in non-federal funds, and complies with the Disaster Recovery Investment Priorities of the U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration, which are:

**Recovery & Resilience:** Projects that assist with economic resilience (including business continuity and preparedness) and long-term recovery from natural disasters and economic shocks to ensure U.S. communities are globally competitive.

**Critical Infrastructure:** Projects that establish the fundamental building blocks of a prosperous and innovative-centric economy and a secure platform for American business, including physical (e.g., broadband, energy, roads, water, sewer) and other economic infrastructure.

**Workforce Development & Manufacturing:** Projects that support the planning and implementation of infrastructure for skills-training centers and related facilities that address the hiring needs of the business community -- particularly in the manufacturing sector -- with a specific emphasis on the expansion of apprenticeships and work-and-learn training models. Also includes projects that encourage job creation and business ex-

pansion in manufacturing, including infrastructure-related efforts that focus on advanced manufacturing of innovative, high-value products and enhancing manufacturing supply chains.

**Exports & FDI:** Primarily infrastructure projects that enhance community assets (e.g., ports facilities) to support growth in U.S. exports and increased foreign direct investment and ultimately the return of jobs to the United States.

#### **COUNTY FUNDING APPLICATION**

##### **#1:**

Funding for infrastructure, road, and utilities project to serve an area of North Ukiah that is already planned and zoned for industrial development, including manufacturing businesses, for the final design and construction of approximately 6,050 linear feet of new roadway with required utilities connecting Ford Road (at the south end) toward North State Street (in the middle), and Orr Springs Road (on the north). The purpose of the road is to provide the necessary infrastructure for light manufacturing jobs to be created by new and expanding businesses that have committed to locating at the site provided the road is built. This road project meets the recovery and resilience, infrastructure improvements, and job creation and manufacturing priority criteria of the EDA. The application is in the amount of \$9,095,746, with \$2,273,937 being provided by the private sector. The project total is \$11,369,683.

#### **COUNTY FUNDING APPLICATION**

##### **#2:**

Funding for a two-year period to fund a County Economic Recovery Coordinator position and economic recovery services to be provided by the WEST Company and the Mendocino County Economic Development Finance Corporation. The EDA grant request total is \$397,180 and the local county match is \$104,000. The total two-year project funding is \$501,180. The purpose of the project is to organize, coordinate, and implement immediate, intermediate, and long term economic recovery and resiliency activities in housing, economic development, broadband, community, business, and infrastructure.
