

RESOLUTION NO. 18-145

RESOLUTION OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DECLARING THE CONTINUATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE MENDOCINO COMPLEX FIRE

WHEREAS, two separate fires, the Ranch Fire and the River Fire, both began on July 27, 2018, at approximately 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM respectively causing conditions of extreme peril; and

WHEREAS, the two different fires, are now called the Mendocino Complex Fire; and

WHEREAS, it is not yet possible to create initial scoping estimates of potential damage costs to public facilities and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2018, the Mendocino County Chief Executive Officer/Director of Emergency Services proclaimed that a local emergency exists throughout Mendocino County; and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2018, Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr., declared a state of emergency for Shasta, Lake, Mendocino, Napa, Riverside and Mariposa counties; and

WHEREAS, on August 5, 2018, President Donald J. Trump issued a major disaster declaration for the State of California as a result of the devastation caused by the fires in Butte, Lake, Mendocino, Napa, and Shasta counties; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2108, the health officer of the County of Mendocino declared a local health emergency, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 101080, which was ratified by the Board of Supervisors at its meeting on July 21, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Mendocino Complex Fire has burned over 304,000 acres and destroyed or damaged several hundred homes and minor structures, resulting in the displacement of hundreds of people; and

WHEREAS, the County of Mendocino continues to experience the effects of the Mendocino Complex Fire; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8630(c) provides that the Board of Supervisors shall review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 30 days until the governing body terminates the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, Mendocino County Code section 7.04.090 provides that the Board of Supervisors shall review the need for continuing the local emergency, but that in no event shall a review take place more than thirty (30) days after the previous review.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors hereby:

1. Proclaims that a local emergency continues to exist throughout Mendocino County due to the Mendocino Complex Fire which commenced on July 27, 2018, and
2. Provides that during this local emergency the powers, functions and duties of the Mendocino County Chief Executive Officer and the emergency organization of

Mendocino County shall be those prescribed by State law, and the ordinances, resolutions and approved emergency services plans of the County of Mendocino.

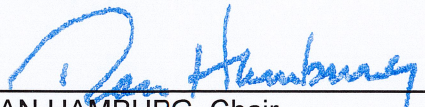
3. Authorizes that Carmel J. Angelo, having the titles of Chief Executive Officer and Director of Emergency Services, is hereby designated as the authorized representative of public and individual assistance of the County of Mendocino for the purpose of receipt, processing and coordination of all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain available State and Federal assistance.

The foregoing Resolution introduced by Supervisor Gjerde, seconded by Supervisor Croskey, and carried this 2nd day of October, 2018, by the following vote:

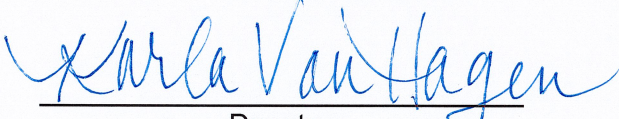

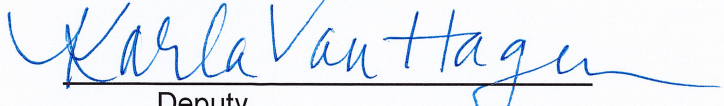
