Lacking a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; sleeping in a public or private place not ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings (e.g., tent, car).

A facility with the primary purpose of providing temporary or transitional shelter for the homeless in general or for specific populations of the homeless. Housing that facilitates movement of the homeless, including those with mental or physical disabilities, to permanent housing within a reasonable amount of time (usually 24 months).

Economic assistance for low- and moderate-income households aimed toward alleviating housing costs; provided in conjunction with state and local housing agencies (e.g., Section 8).

Community-based housing without a designated length of stay in which formerly homeless individuals and families that do not require supportive services live as independently as possible.

Rental and home ownership in the private real estate market, for which the occupant is paying no more than 30% of his income for gross housing costs, including utilities.
