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

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors will conduct a public hearing in their chambers at the Mendocino County Administration Center, Board of Supervisors Chambers, 501 Low Gap Road, Room 1070, Ukiah, California on Tuesday, April 9, 2019, at 9:00 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the item may be heard, on the following Ordinance:

AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE MENDOCINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS EXTENDING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE CULTIVATION OF GENETI-CALLY MODIFIED ORGANISMS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF MENDOCINO COUNTY PENDING THE STUDY AND CON-SIDERATION OF LAND USE AND OTHER REGULATIONS PERTAIN-ING TO SUCH CULTIVATION

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINA-TION: It has been determined that the ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15060(c)(2), 15060(c)(3), 15061(b)(3) and 15308.

This urgency ordinance creates interim restrictions on the cultivation of genetically modified organisms, as defined in the ordinance. This urgency ordinance is extending the provisions of the urgency ordinance adopted on February 26, 2019, for an additional period of ten (10) months and fifteen (15) days, or until February 24, 2020, pursuant to the provisions of Government Code Section 65858.

ORDINANCE SUMMARY: Under the ordinance, the cultivation of genetically modified organisms for any purposes is prohibited and the County shall not issue any permit, registration or approval related to the cultivation of genetically modified organisms. Cultivation of genetically modified organisms in violation of the ordinance constitute a public nuisance which may be enforced or abated by any means available by law, including but not limited to Mendocino County Code Chapters 1.08 and 8.75; if the cultivation includes genetically modified cannabis, the cultivation may be abated pursuant to Chapter 8.76. The ordinance contains findings establishing the urgency as required by Government Code section 65858. Copies of the urgency ordinance referenced above and the report required pursuant to Government Code section 65858(d) and other details of this item are available for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, 501 Low Gap Road, Room 1010, Ukiah, California, during regular business hours, and available online at https://www.mendocinocoun ty.org/government/board-ofsupervisors/county-code.

Your comments regarding the ordinance are invited. Written comments should be submitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, at 501 Low Gap Road, Room 1010, Ukiah, California, 95482, no later than April 8, 2019. Oral and written comments may be presented to the Board of Supervisors during the public hearing.

If you challenge the adoption of the ordinance in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors or the Board of Supervisors at, or prior to, the public hearing. All persons are invited to appear and present testimony in this matter.
