The County's partner to facilitate residents' preparedness


Approach:

### FY2018 Accomplishments in Operations

- > Hired part-time Program Coordinator
- Increased support for Neighborhood FSCs
- Newly installed Board of Directors (BOD)
- > BOD approved Organizational Chart
- Formalized Technical Advisory Group
- Reactivated Membership and Volunteer Participation
- Initiated Subcommittees (focus areas)





### FY2018 Accomplishments in Operations (con't)

- Supported creation of over 30 new neighborhood Fire Safe Councils
- Provided over 300 "Reflect to Protect" address signs
- Subcommittees underway:
  - > Governance/Policy
  - > Membership
  - > Education/Outreach/Marketing
  - Fundraising: Grant Writing/Special Events
  - > Programs/Guest Speakers
  - > Prescribed Fire





### FY2018 Accomplishments in Education/Outreach

- > Hosted monthly FSC meetings, distributed literature
- Participated in over twenty neighborhood FSC meetings, promoted collaboration
- > Presented at over 25 Public Events, Workshops, Expos
- Four Radio interviews
- > Numerous Newspaper articles
- > Website improvements: firesafemendocino.org



### FY2018 Accomplishments in Project Planning

Applied to, or partnered in applications:

- > CAL FIRE Fire Prevention Grants
  - Community Chipper Program (\$1.4M)
  - Willits Fuels Reduction (\$1.8M)
  - Western Hills Ukiah (\$1.65M)
  - Hazardous Tree Removal Mendo Fire (\$990K)
- > Community Foundation
  - Home Ignition Zone Workshop (\$10K)
  - Business Plan for long-term strategy (\$12K)



### FY2018 Accomplishments in Project Implementation

#### Awarded:

- > PG&E Fuels Management (\$80,000) complete
- Creating Fire Adapted Communities in the Navarro River Watershed (\$92,922) - underway
- > CAL FIRE California Climate Initiative Forest Health grant. (\$1.9M) - underway
- > Hazardous Tree Removal Rdwd Fire (\$950K)
- > FEMA Ignition Resistant Const. (\$2.25M)
- Community Chipper Program Business Plan Development (\$8,000)

### FY2019 Plans for Operations

- > Automation of various MCFSC services through modernized website
- Increased organizational capacity through active volunteer subcommittees
- > Finalized Technical Advisory Group Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)
- > Special Events, Topic specific workshops
- > New membership benefits
- > MCFSC working to operate more independently of MCRCD fiscal sponsor to be less burden on RCD resources



### FY2019 Plans for Education/Outreach

- Continued growth in, and effectiveness of neighborhood Fire Safe Councils
- Facilitate active volunteer subcommittee dedicated to education/outreach
- > Improved website with a wide range of fire-preparedness resources
- Calendar of Events, highlighting meetings, Workshops, Events
- > Updated "Living with Wildfire" magazine for Mendocino County



### FY2019 Plans for Project Planning

- > Develop grant applications for countywide fire preparedness projects
- > Gather project needs from local FSCs
- CAL FIRE CCI Forest Health Phase II with Lake County
- Expand services to reach countywide, including underserved and underrepresented communities



FY2019 Plans for Project Implementation

- > Hazardous Tree Removal
- FEMA Fire-resistant construction
- > CAL FIRE CCI Phase I and Phase II
- > MCFSC BUSINESS PLAN
  - long-term strategy for
  - vegetation management
  - for underserved residents and for
  - self-sustainment of the FSC.



FY2019 Plans in Summary

- > Operations: Full-time Program Coordinator ensures uninterrupted support to County residents.
- Edu/Outreach: More info and availability to the public
- Proj Planning: More support to the County for activities in disaster preparedness
- Proj Implementation: Self-sustaining plan for fuels reduction
- <u>Result</u>: Better organized communities reducing demand on County Gov't resources
