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PROPOSED DELIVERABLES FOR MCCAPCC aka ADVOCATES SUPPORTING COAST KIDS FY 2019/2020

In 2019/2020 our coastal chapter intends to continue the work of informing our community about the issue of childhood trauma and resiliency. This is a message that needs to be widely shared, so our focus will be to inform more professionals and community members about the effects of child abuse and neglect and how we can create greater resiliency in our community.

- a. **Child Abuse Prevention Education program in the Fort Bragg, Mendocino, and Point Arena Schools** – Project Sanctuary is an experienced provider of information about staying safe for children of all ages. Support from the Children's Trust Fund will help provide a Prevention Presenter to deliver age appropriate lessons in three school districts.
- b. **Support for Young Children's Family Advocate located at Safe Passage to promote childhood trauma prevention and resiliency** – The Five Protective Factors including healthy activities to promote healthy relationships among family members, and resiliency for those who have suffered from childhood trauma, will be the focus of this position.
- c. **Outreach materials to inform children, parents, grandparents, childcare providers, and professionals about childhood trauma** – Books, videos, curriculum materials, information for local resources, are examples of the variety of ways we will use this funding. Support for the April event for coastal families and the Healthy Mendocino Childhood Trauma Action Team annual events will be provided.
- d. **April event for coastal family providers to celebrate Child Abuse Prevention Month and Dia del Nino** – An annual Fort Bragg event to provide information to families regarding childhood trauma and resiliency.
- e. **Support for an event for coastal families to promote Safe Communities** – We will collaborate with the Fort Bragg Police Department and Mendocino County Youth Project to bring many youth-serving organizations together for a free event held at Bainbridge Park in May 2020 with the focus of protecting our community's children from harm.
- f. **Professional development for training and collaboration** – Coastal persons interested in training opportunities and meetings requiring out of town travel will be eligible for support for travel costs. In addition, trainings can be provided locally to help childcare and other service providers be better prepared to address the needs of their clients.
- g. **Concrete support for underserved children living in precarious conditions** – Children living at risk of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) have parents facing many challenges, so extra help will be provided with items such as gas cards, bus passes, quarters for laundry and showers and drop-in CV Starr passes.
