RE: Public Input to Cannabis Non-Cultivation Ordinance

Thank you, to the Board of Supervisors and to those individuals in Planning & Building, Environmental Health, and all county departments involved in crafting regulations for Mendocino's cannabis industry. We are particularly gratified by the solicitous and open-minded approach you all are taking by meeting with and incorporating community member input into this ordinance. I support the recommendations already submitted by Casey O'Neill from the CGA.

Here are some added specific suggestions going forward with this process:

- ♦ The key lesson we can learn from Colorado and Oregon in particular is to NOT separate medical and "adult use" cannabis dispensary and delivery sales. That separation would kill the medical cannabis side of the industry and its growing health care service for a rapidly expanding patient population. Cannabis medicine is fast becoming the focus of patient followalong studies, quantitative research initiatives, and product R&D. (Attached to this letter you'll see a patient study conducted in connection with Stanford University and examples of two prominent medicinal cannabis conferences highlighting this work). We are in the beginning stages of raising the standard toward dispensary staff training and up-to-date patient counseling on medicine purchases. In the absence of a much-needed public education campaign, there is little incentive for people to pay for a doctor's recommendation if they can simply walk into an "adult-use dispensary" and purchase any cannabis product.
- ♦ Permit on-site use for patients who can't consume their medicine at home. Many patients suffer discrimination from landlords, neighbors, employers who don't understand medicinal cannabis. Often the only safe place for them to consume their medicine is at their dispensary/wellness center.
- ♦ Vertical license integration is essential for us to contribute to the new medicinal cannabis health industry. Without our ability to hold related licenses, we cannot compete and stay alive economically. We need to have nurseries to connect the creation of new strains with patient outcomes. We need to be able to deliver to our home-bound patients. We are less attractive to potential investors who can provide much-needed capital to scale up and meet the quality standards for safe, effective cannabis medicine. We need to connect manufacturers solely devoted to improving new, complex infused products directly with patient outcomes, studies and our work with health care professionals. We can do this by linking manufacturing directly with patients. This integrated approach is the wave of the future.
- ♦ The current definitions of volatile and non-volatile solvents manufacturing licenses are misnamed and will result in a complete loss of critical medicines currently used. This archaic separation is being addressed on the state level and must be brought up to date in county regulations as well. Many of our tinctures and oils are made by simply soaking raw plant matter
