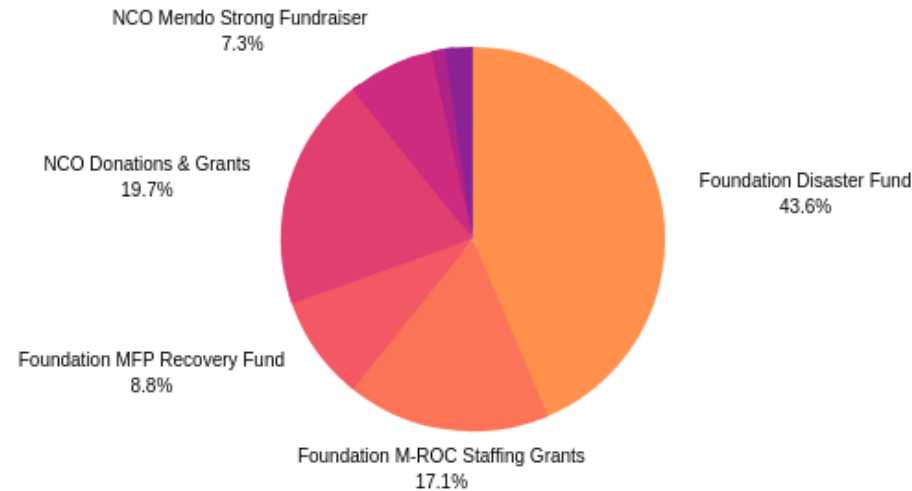

INFRASTRUCTURE CONTRIBUTORS

Infrastructure, including staffing and administrative overhead, are the unglamorous yet critical pieces to a successful recovery. With the goal of directing all donations to survivors, M-ROC partners have sought grants and sponsorships to cover these expenses. Some of the major contributors to infrastructure costs include: Tipping Point Emergency Relief Fund, Genentech, Inc., Silver Giving Foundation, California Community Foundation, May and Stanley Smith Charitable Trust, Joseph and Vera Long Foundation, Rebuild Wine Country, Red Cross, Redwood Credit Union, County of Mendocino, City of Ukiah, Mendocino Forest Products, Community First Credit Union, California Endowment, and State Dept. of Community Services & Development.

FUND MANAGEMENT

North Coast Opportunities, Inc. administers the grants for all M-ROC individual assistance and case management staffing. Funding partners transfer their contributions to NCO to distribute out to fire survivors. These funding partners include The Community Foundation, Mendo Strong Fundraiser, Redwood Credit Union, United Way of the Wine Country, Lutheran Social Services and South Ukiah Rotary. The County of Mendocino facilitated GSFA and other government funding sources.

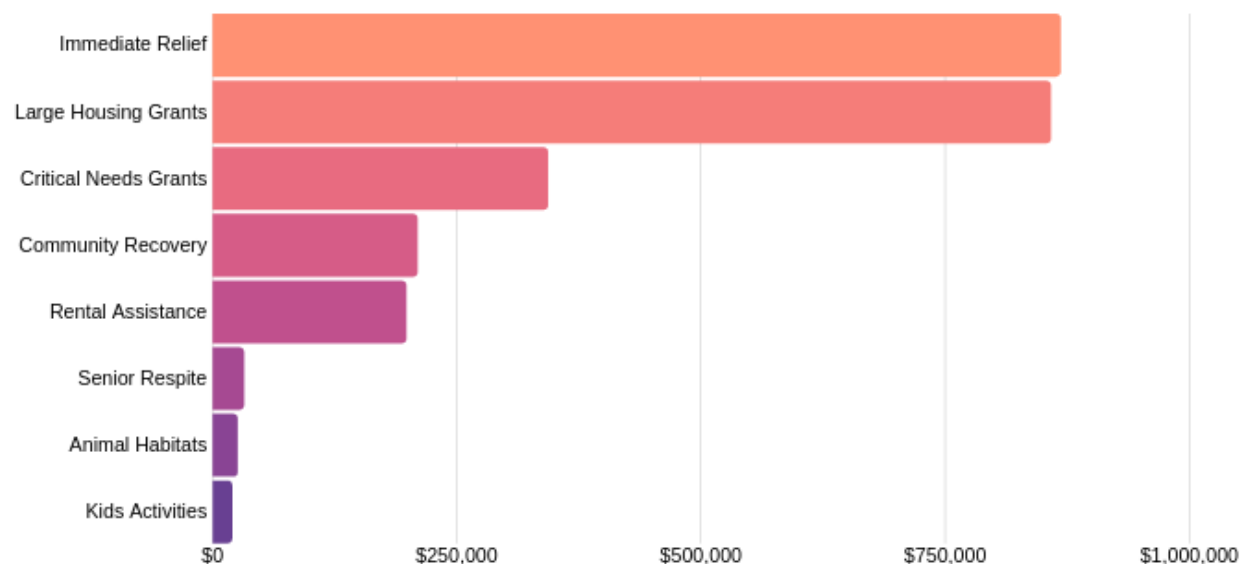

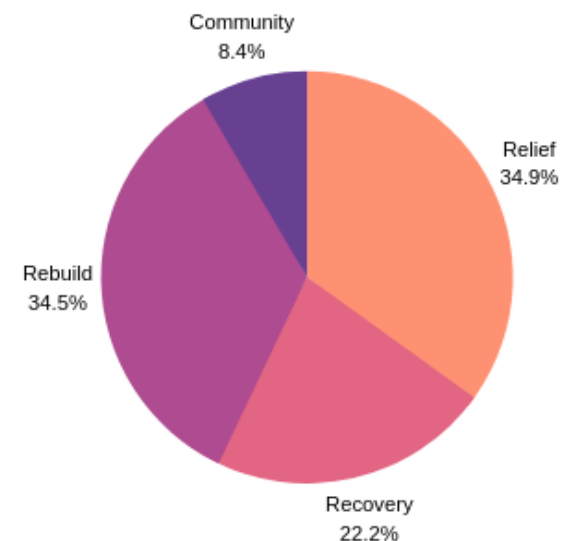

LOOKING AHEAD YEAR TWO AND BEYOND

When we reflect on all the work we have done in Year-One it is with a sense of pride. From building the infrastructure from the ground-up to raising dollars, it has truly been a group effort. We did our best to reach out to all survivor households to understand its needs, to be responsive in developing resources when needs arose, and we held a long-term vision to help survivors secure permanent housing. In the coming year and beyond we will focus our energy on rebuilding and resiliency.

With roughly \$1.9M remaining, Mendocino-ROC partners will pair these funds with new Year-Two funding partners to help fire survivors. These include nearly \$400k from the American Red Cross, \$1M from a County collaborative with the Community Development Commission (CDC) for CalHome loans to qualifying survivors, new staffing funded through United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), a new Home Hardening grant to mitigate future damage, improvements to the Redwood Valley Water System through County funding support, and the Community Foundation's new Resiliency and Preparedness Fund. Together we are committed to helping our neighbors return home and become more resilient in the face of future disasters.
