

# History of Clean River Alliance

- Founded by Chris Brokate in December 2014
  - Wanted to clean up the Russian River after seeing effects of heavy rain bringing trash downstream
- Organizes trash cleanups, teaches homeless clean camp habits, and operates the homeless trash program in Guerneville, Santa Rosa, Healdsburg, Cloverdale, Hopland, and now Ukiah
- "Clean camps=clean river. Positively engaging the homeless leads to behavior changes and accountability, evictions will not change behavior."
- Hundreds of thousands of pounds of trash

#### **CRA Mission:**

To remove trash from the Russian River watershed and to educate citizens about the problem of trash in our waters by creating more public clean-up events.

## What is a trash service for the homeless anyway?

- Homeless people have trash, but nowhere to put it
- Trash accumulates in encampments until heavy rainfall
- Trash gets swept downstream and ends up in the ocean
- CRA supplies the homeless with trash bags and a pickup date
- Dramatically decreases the amount of trash in the river/community

- Bright orange and labelled
- Brought with maps to Mcavhn, Inland Winter Shelter, and Plowshares
- Over 200+ bags have been given out
