



PROCLAMATION

OF THE

MENDOCINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RECOGNIZING

the 35th Anniversary of the Consolidated Tribal Health Project in Mendocino County

WHEREAS, Consolidated Tribal Health Project (CTHP) is a 501(c)3 community health clinic founded in 1984 with the primary purpose of serving the health needs of the American Indian/Alaska Native population in Mendocino County, California through a Title V compact with Indian Health Service; and

WHEREAS, the clinic is governed by a consortium of eight (8) federally recognized tribes including: the Cahto Tribe of the Laytonville Rancheria, the Coyote Valley Band of Pomo Indians, the Guidiville Rancheria of California, the Hopland Band of Pomo Indians, Pinoleville Pomo Nation, the Potter Valley Tribe, the Little River Band of Pomo Indians of the Redwood Valley Rancheria, and the Sherwood Valley Band of Pomo Indians.; and

WHEREAS, Consolidated Tribal Health Project, Inc. is committed to healthy lifestyles and honoring traditional Native American values to maintain physical, mental, emotional, spiritual and social wellbeing of their community. Their services include behavioral health, dental, medical and patient support programs; and

WHEREAS, the Clinic throughout the years has had many achievements and received numerous recognition for their services and programs. Recently their Dental Department was recognized as the Top Dental Performer in the Nation by Indian Health Service. Specifically, the Consolidated Tribal Health Project received the 2018 National Dental GPRA Award as having the "Best Overall Performance"; and

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Tribal Health Project's dedication to providing quality care for the local American Indian population demonstrates their commitment to the initiative that healthcare is a right for all people.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino, hereby congratulates the Consolidated Tribal Health Project on their 35th anniversary serving the health needs of its people.
