I ask that agriculture businesses (farms, ranches, farmers markets, etc.) and processing facilities be defined as "essential businesses" and be allowed to continue to operate. Social distancing or other measures can continue to be implemented by essential businesses.

It is times like these farmers and ranchers roles in our society are even more evident. Today people in our county are placing orders of beef or produce with local farmers/ranchers to stock up for the next few weeks. It is because of farmers and ranchers that they are able to have food on their table.

Please keep farmers and ranchers defined as "essential businesses" so they can keep operating.
