

Hello,

My landlords have just served me with a 60-day notice to vacate the home I rent from them, so they can move her mom into this house. I'm feeling that their ending my lease at this time in itself seems like a violation of the shelter-in-place order--it will certainly cause me to violate it, but checking with you about it. Nowhere in any of your notices do I see "house hunting" to be an essential activity, but for me it has become one, unless you determine that they cannot do this at this time. I am 63 years old with a few age-related health problems that I feel put me at high risk for the Corona virus, and I'm displeased to say the least, at the idea of exposing myself as much as will be necessary to locate new suitable housing and move my entire household at this time in this situation.

I see that the shelter-in-place ordinance is now being enforced with citations and fines, so I really need to know if you consider moving house to be an essential activity under the circumstances. My landlords are wanting her mom, who is currently living with them, to have her own place, but I don't believe this is the only way to achieve that--just it's easiest for them, but I feel they are putting my life at risk by insisting on this at this time, and also the lives of all the people I will likely have to come in contact with during this relocation process, and the health of the community at large.
