- -An elderly woman fell and got hurt, she can not live in her home any longer, her kids live out of state and can not afford to put her in a nursing home with out selling her home to pay for it.
- -A few months ago an older retired couple took a huge hit to their savings after the stock market crashed. They have to sell their 4 bedroom home and downsize to a small mobile home because they they can not afford their home or two mortgages so they must sell their 4 bedroom home now.
- -A single father lost his job and must move to Texas to a new job, he can not afford two mortgages and must sell his house now.
