Current Mitigation Strategies

Program cuts

- Evaluating required services and opportunity costs
- Evaluating all contracts for partial or full reduction
- Implemented soft hiring freeze to consider potential reductions

Reserve Spending

- Re-evaluating multi-year plans for all designated reserves
- Uses are limited and specific for all fund balances and reserves

Revenue enhancements and internal borrowing

- Increase Federal Financial Participation during FMAP enhancement
- Continue to apply for COVID-19 Relief funding and other grants
- Future projects/capital/IT versus program sustainability



Current Mitigation Strategies (continued)



Deferrals

- Postpone or defer capital improvements and maintenance
- Further evaluate and possibly defer local match funding
- Hold some vacant positions until further analysis

Trigger cuts

- Manage administration staffing levels and duties in IHSS Public Authority
- Monitor all program areas impacted by State triggers

Advocate

- Continue waivers that allow modified and efficient ways of doing business
- Change MHSA regulations to allow Innovation dollars to be redirected
- Continue expanded FMAP/Federal Financial Participation
- Enhance investments in public health and communicable disease control
