Date Governor Signed	Bill Designation	Scope of Reform
August 11, 2015	SB 89	Protects citizens' right to video/film peace officers.
August 11, 2015	SB 227	Prohibits use of grand jury proceedings closed to the public in deciding whether to charge officers in police killings; must go by means of a preliminary hearing before a magistrate and open to the public.
October 3, 2015	AB 71	Requires reporting of data on police killings.
October 3, 2015	AB 256	Makes it a felony for a police officer to tamper with digital evidence (i.e., body cam, Watch Guard, digital images, etc.)
October 3, 2015	AB 953	Mandates police training on racial/identity profiling and implicit bias.
October 3, 2015	SB 11	Requires POST to evaluate and improve peace officer training related to interacting with the mentally ill or those with intellectual disabilities.
October 3, 2015	SB 29	Requires peace officers receive at least eight hours of crisis intervention training.
October 5, 2017	SB 54	Creates sanctuary state for undocumented immigrants. Prohibits local cooperation with Feds.
Sept. 30, 2018	AB 748	Requires public release of body cam video/images within 45 days of a deadly force incident.
Sept. 30, 2018	SB 1421	Requires public release of police misconduct findings, including deadly force, taser user, sexual assault, etc.
August 19, 2019	AB 392	Changes state standard for use of deadly force from "reasonable" to "necessary."
