January 2019: The County of Mendocino and The Community Foundation of Mendocino County partner to achieve a complete count for Census 2020.

- The count determines the amount of funding the county will receive over the next 10 years.
- \$10,000 per person for the decade.
- Funds: school lunches, mental health services, wildfire management, education, veteran care, wildlife restoration, business grants, highway construction, poverty abatement, water pollution control, and housing for the elderly.

- . Multi-pronged outreach campaign, with a multi-cultural and bi-lingual focus.

Shifting to new challenges . Setback:

- . COVID-19 pandemic
- . Pivot:
 - Strong digital outreach, including social media and influencers. Bilingual influencer tool kits as part of influencer campaign.






SUCCESS


Successfully increased the self response rate over 2010 rate








SELF RESPONSE RATE – 2010 VS 2020
