I am deeply disappointed to know that In 2020 alone, California Wildlife Services killed 24,264 wild native animals statewide, including 56 black bears, 39 mountain lions ~ and 3,252 coyotes! Shocking! I once looked up to Wildlife Services. I now see them as cold hearted butchers and an enemy to living beings. What message are we sending out to people when we allow trusted agents to slaughter and abuse the innocent? It is long past time to respect all life and make plans and arrangements to live together peacefully. Animals lives matter, too.

It is my hope that there are compassionate and feeling board members that will protect the innocent and allow other compassionate humans to manage animal care moving forward. I am asking the board to:

- Terminate Mendocino County's contract with the USDA Wildlife Services and its lethal Integrated Wildlife Damage Management (IWDM) Program
- 2. Establish a Non-lethal Wildlife Damage Management (NWDM) Program to be administered locally
