I would like to express my support for The Urgency Ordinance placing a moratorium on the implementation of phase III of The Cannabis Cultivation Permitting process.

Mendocino County is in the midst of a significant drought. As of today March 21st of 2021. Annual Rainfall for the Ukiah area is at 57%. A 43% reduction in the rainfall is a disaster. As many municipalities claim in pleas and efforts to reduce water consumption and as justification for raising water rates.

The Cannabis Cultivation permitting process has been a complete disaster to small farmers. I hold The County of Mendocino and You Our elected representatives responsible for creating a disaster for our community and it's small farmers.

The Cannabis Cultivation permitting process has failed to hold growers accountable for violations of cannabis cultivation regulations. Inspections are not being performed to the degree necessary to insure regulatory compliance. An expansion into phase III at this point in time is reckless and irresponsible in my personal opinion.

Phase III would exacerbate the challenges that our small farmers face and would exhibit favor to Cannabis Corporations. An un level permitting process is detrimental to our small farmers. Mendocino County must do better to protect our environment, Our Community and Our way of Life.
