

Please consider this as a very strong statement of opposition to the proposed expansion of allowing more cannabis production--especially in Rangeland areas.

My wife and I have lived on a large parcel of 160 acres of Rangeland off Boonville Highway/Robinson Creek Road for over 30 years. We like our homesite but existing laws are already allowing so much marijuana that we can smell it as much as a mile away! This is ridiculous and we do not believe that was the intent of the Rangeland classification when made many years ago. The limited roads (all unpaved) create lots of dust and air pollution and the traffic up and down the roads have a major impact. Also, water is becoming a serious problem. Our old well (originally rated at 60gpm) dried out in the summer and we have had to drill twice as deep to get less water than our original output. Where do you think the additional water for more grows is going to come from? You need to consider the impacts on existing uses before allowing more water demand.
