Notice of Public Hearing to Approve Community Development Block Grant CARES Act Funding Application for Phase II Improvements to Live Oak Apartments (Project Homekey, 555 South Orchard Ave Ukiah)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the County of Mendocino Board of Supervisors at their regular meeting on **Tuesday, April 20, 2021** at **9:00** AM will conduct a public hearing to approve, by resolution, an application for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) CARES Act funds for Phase II improvements to the Live Oak Apartments (Project Homekey, 555 South Orchard Ave Ukiah).

The California Department of Housing and Community Development announced the availability of approximately \$77.1 million in funding pursuant to the Coronavirus Ald, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act in a Notice of Funding Availability on December 18, 2020. This Notice of Funding Availability includes an allocation of Community Development Block Grant funds for Mendocino County in the amount of \$1,069,157. This Notice represents the second and third funding allocations of these funds. The county approved an application for the first allocation of these funds in the amount of \$293,812 on August 18, 2020 for the purpose of providing financial assistance to microenterprise businesses impacted by COVID-19.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds must meet one of three National Objectives that include benefitting low-moderate income households or persons, address slum and blight, or meet an urgent community development need re-sulting from a state or federally declared disaster. In addition to meeting the CDBG National Objectives, the CARES Act CDBG funds must be used to directly prevent, prepare for, or respond to COVID-19 impacts. The pur-pose of this public meeting is to give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known regarding these eligible activities and the application to be considered by the Board in the amount of \$1,069,157 for the purpose of providing improvements to the Live Oak Apartments (Project Homekey, 555 South Orchard Ave Ukiah).

ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES UNDER THE ABOVE ALLOCATIONS IN THE NOFA MAY CONSIST OF:

HOMEOWNERSHIP ASSISTANCE AND HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAMS; PUBLIC SERVICE PROGRAMS, PLANNING STUDIES, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BUSINESS ASSISTANCE AND MICROENTERPRISE ACTIVITIES. ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES PAID FOR WITH STATE CDBG FUNDS MUST MEET ONE OR MORE OF THE THREE NATIONAL OBJECTIVES LISTED IN CDBG FEDERAL STATUTES AS FOLLOWS: BENEFIT TO LOW-MODERATE INCOME HOUSEHOLDS OR PERSONS; ELIMINATION OF SLUMS AND BLIGHT; OR MEETING URGENT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEED.
