I urge you to not proceed with the Phase 3 proposal until the following conditions are met:

- our water situation has improved.
- The existing environmental damage from the illegal Cannabis growers has been cleaned up.
- The dysfunction in the Planning and Building Dept., Cannabis Program, and Code Enforcement has been corrected.
- Much should be done to improve these departments before inviting more expansion of this problematic industry.
- A comprehensive EIR has been done.

The people in compliance with our existing ordinance should be a priority at this time.

Prolonged drought will likely bring the need to scale back on irrigated acreage, not increase it.


How do you "scale up" the Cannabis industry when our water resources and soil are in decline ?

Drought = Warming temperatures and changing precipitation patterns


Drought will


- Increase conflicts when there isn't enough water
