Please stop the adoption of the proposed Cannabis Land Use Ordinance and ensure that any expansion of cannabis in Mendocino County must be preceded by an Environmental Impact Report.

I'm wondering if you read all of the articles, the excellent investigative reporting by Karen Rifkin, in the Ukiah Daily Journal.

And, if you read them and viewed the photos, the problems with this Cannabis Land Use Ordinance to Mendocino County were described vividly through multiple perspectives.

If this expansion is not stopped, and you allow it to go forward as proposed, the problems for the future will continue to multiply with far-reaching impacts that will never allow us to turn back to the beautiful and sustainable County that we love.

I implore you, Mo, to slow down and enforce the ordinance that you have on the books now, and take the time to support the County

in dealing with current applications and compliance,
