

Recovery Project	Cost Estimate	Description
1. * Update General Plan Safety Element 25% Non-Federal Funding Match	\$41,457	Update the Safety Element in the General Plan to incorporate the County's Hazard Mitigation Plan. Federal Share of project was funded through HMGP
2. * Update Hazard Mitigation Plan 25% Non-Federal Funding Match	\$62,500	Update County Hazard Mitigation Plan Federal Share of project was funded through HMGP
3. * Ignition Resistance Construction Phase I 25% Non-Federal Funding Match	\$100,000	A rebate program for property owners who install Class A roofs and vents in their homes. Federal Share of project was funded through HMGP
4. * Mendocino County Early Warning Sirens 25% Non-Federal Funding Match	\$43,054	Conduct a feasibility/pilot study to determine siren type, mounting requirements, power sources, coordination with existing alert systems, and effective locations for the installation of early warning sirens at locations recommended in the feasibility study. Preliminary analysis and budgeting anticipates installations of 4 sirens in Redwood Valley-Calpella Fire District. Federal Share of project is pending agency review through HMGP
5. * Mendocino County Community Fire Safety Initiatives – Bower Park Tree Removal	\$200,000	Bower Park hazardous tree removal (remove & dispose 82 trees threatening park infrastructure)
6. * Mendocino County Community Fire Safety Initiatives – Mariposa Park Clean-up	\$100,000	Mariposa Park hazardous tree removal and clean-up
7. * County Cultural Responsiveness on Tribal Lands	\$15,000	Increase cultural awareness of Emergency Services personnel and other local agencies to respond appropriately to events on Tribal lands. Educate personnel about the proper protection of indigenous archaeological sites and protection of cultural resources.

Recovery Project	Cost Estimate	Description
8. * Public Health Preparedness and Hydration Stations	\$80,000	During extreme heat, hydration stations are of vital importance, especially to the County's most vulnerable populations. This project is part of the County's commitment to proactively prepare for future extreme heat events.
9. * Develop a Plan for Safe Emergency Ingress/Egress for Secondary Roads	\$250,000	Develop a plan for emergency ingress and egress on secondary roads. Identify public and county roads that lack secondary escape routes and require ingress and egress emergency plans.
10. Fire Hydrant Installation in Redwood Valley	\$250,000	Installing new fire hydrants within the burn area.
11. County Wide Water Supply Resilience and Reliability Analysis	\$500,000	Obtain a consultant who can develop a comprehensive analysis of reliability of county wide water supply.
12. Conduct a County Wide Environment Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration	\$700,000	Obtain a consultant who can conduct a county wide EIR on identified projects, or determine if projects meet Negative Declaration requirements. There are a handful of projects which have been identified as shovel ready, but have been denied grant funding due to lack of CEQA documentation or Negative Declarations.
13. Develop a COVID-19 Recovery Plan	\$250,000	Develop a COVID-19 Recovery Plan
14. COVID-19 Phase I Plan Implementation	\$500,000	Direct financial assistance to public through community partners
