Please consider doing an EIR before moving forward with your plans to expand. I have lived in Round Valley for over 30 years. My deepest concern is the water issue. The illegal grows that have produced crime, garbage, pesticides and literally changed our community, is another issue that has not been addressed or dealt with at all. I have watched good tax paying citizens move away because of things getting so out of control.

It appears that you are losing the trust of the communities you serve with the proposal of this ordinance that seems to be very rushed. It's common sense to everyone that we should look at the impact on our environment and community before you vote to move forward on such an aggressive plan.
