






# **Site Visit Key Findings**




- Community Leaders

## **Drought Task Force Data Needs**











- <u>Policy Recommendation:</u> Temporarily waive permitting requirements for up to 5000 gal storage tanks for domestic needs
- <u>Possible Actions:</u>
  - Engage local, State, Federal partners and the private sector to ensure community drinking water needs are met
    - Coastal communities
    - Groundwater
  - Prioritize water supplies
    - Health & human safety
    - Economic vibrancy
    - Environmental resiliency
  - Compile water status data
